

Wednesday August 14th
Lat 45° 33' N Long 28° 37' W. Fine weather all the day
The first and middle part of this day with light breeze from
N.E. to N. the ship heading from N.E. to N.W. spoke the
Brig/Edo from Manila bound to Bremen. Also spoke and passed
with the ship/Edo from New Bedford. Master E. J. Smith
out 100 of firm. The latter part foggy with a light breeze from N.E. to
course, N.E. and so ends.

Thursday August 15th
Lat 47° 01' N Long 27° 30' W. Thick fog the first part
The middle and latter part clear. The wind light and from N.E. to N.
The ship heading from N.E. to N.W. Several sails in sight
and grampuses. The 2. Mate off duty. Sick the watch employed in
ship duty and so ends.

Friday August 16th
Lat 48° 37' N Long 26° 15' W. The first and middle parts
smokey with light breeze from N.W. to N. The ship heading
from N.E. to N.W. Several sails in sight and grampuses.
The latter part smokey and foggy. The ship heading to N.W. by
the wind. A fresh breeze from N. and so ends.

Saturday August 17th
Lat 49° 44' N Long 25° 38' W. Thick fog most of this
day with light variable winds and calms. The ship heading in all
directions during the day. Grampuses around. The watch employed
in ship duty and so ends.

Sunday August 18th
Lat 49° 44' N Long 25° 15' W. Breeze and calm the first
part of the middle part strong breeze from N.W. to N. by N. the
ship heading to the S.E. by E. The wind under double reefed the sails.
Raining hard. The latter part quite clear with a fresh breeze from N.E.
The ship heading to N.W. by N. under cruising sail and so ends.

Monday August 19th
Lat 49° 00' N Long 24° 01' W. Clear weather most
of this day with light breeze from N.W. The first part the ship
heading to S.E. by E. The middle part calm. The latter part
light breeze from S.E. The ship heading to N.W. Wall and
saw grampuses. The watch employed in ship duty and
so ends.

Tuesday August 20th
Lat 49° 20' N Long 22° 51' W. Cloudy the first part the
middle part rainy. A fresh breeze from N.W. the ship heading to N.W. by N. spoke
the ship/Edo from N.W. The latter part the wind from N.E. to N.W. The ship
steered by the wind and on both tacks during the time under double reef
to speak. Saw grampuses and so ends.

Wednesday August 21th
Lat 49° 00' N Long 21° 09' W. Clear weather all this day
with light breeze from N.W. course S.W. The first and latter parts
the middle part course N.E. Several sails in sight and lots of
grampuses. The watch employed in ship duty and so ends.

Thursday August 22nd
Lat 49° 55' N Long 20° 38' W. Fine weather most of
this day with light variable winds. The ship on both tacks during
the day and heading from N.W. by E. to N.W. Several sails in sight and lots of
grampuses around. The watch employed in making spungarn and
so ends this day.

Friday August 23rd
Lat 49° 14' N Long 19° 44' W. Fine weather all this day
with light variable winds. The ship on both tacks during the day
and heading from N.W. to E. Several sails in sight. Lots of grampuses
around. The watch employed in ship duty and so ends.

Saturday August 24th
Lat 49° 33' N Long 18° 31' W. Smokey all this day with a
little rain and light variable winds. The ship steered by the wind and
on both tacks during the day and heading from N.W. to S.E. by E. Lots
of grampuses around. One sail in sight. Also the sound of pick. The
watch making spungarn and so ends.

Sunday August 25th
Lat 49° 05' N Long 17° 36' W. Clear weather the first part
with a fresh breeze from N.W. The ship heading to N.E. by the wind.
Pico and Loyalty in sight. The middle part squally and raining.
with a fresh breeze from N.W. The ship now heading to N.E. by E.
The latter part smokey. The ship heading to N.W. with a good breeze
from N.E. One sail in sight and so ends.
