

Monday August 26th
Clear weather all this day with a fresh breeze from N.E. The ship heading to S.W. at sunset the point of the Island of St. John N.W. 40 miles distant, luffed to and shortened sail the ship with took during the night a day light kept day between the Island and spoke a whaling bark from Eyal, several other sails in sight course the latter part N.W. and so ends

Tuesday August 27th
Fine weather the first and middle and part of the latter parts with a fresh breeze from N.E. Flores in sight course S.W. by N. The remainder of the day rainy with light variable winds the ship heading to the westward and so ends

Wednesday August 28th
Lat 39 08 N Long 37 49 W Fine weather the first part the middle part pleasant the wind light and from the S.W. the ship heading to the westward course S.W. by N. Several sails in sight, saw grampus and so ends

Thursday August 29th
Lat 39 30 N Long 36 33 W Fine weather all this day with light breezes from S.W. to N.E. Course W. by N. the first part and N.W. the remainder of the day the watch employed in ships duty and so ends

Friday August 30th
Lat 39 25 N Long 35 23 W Fine weather all this day with light breezes from S.W. The ship heading at number of courses during the day One sail in sight and so ends

Saturday August 31st
Lat 40 30 N Long 33 50 W Fine weather all this day with light breezes from S.W. to S.E. The ship heading to S.E. the first part, spoke and gamed with the fore and main land, the middle and latter parts the ship heading to S.E. Several sails in sight and so ends

Sunday September 1st
Lat 43 45 N Long 30 45 W Fine weather the first and middle parts with light breezes from S.W. The latter parts little wind and a fresh breeze from S.W. The ship heading S.E. by E and so ends several sails in sight, and so ends

Monday September 2nd
Lat 43 23 N Long 28 30 W Fine weather all this day with light breezes from S.W. to S.E. The ship heading from S.E. by S to S.W. all day, saw grampus and black fish, number of sails in sight and so ends

Tuesday September 3rd
Lat 41 32 N Long 26 30 W Fine weather all this day with good breeze from S.E. to S.W. The ship stered by the wind and on both tacks during the day a number of sails in sight and so ends

Wednesday September 4th
Lat 40 00 N Long 23 00 W Fine weather all this day with light breezes from S.W. The ship stered by the wind and on both tacks during the day a number of sails in sight, saw grampus, and so ends.

Thursday September 5th
The first part cloudy with light breezes from S.W. The ship heading to S.W. by N. Flores in sight. The middle and part of the latter part rainy with variable winds the ship off and on the islands one sail in sight and so ends

Friday September 6th
A ship and rainy most of this day with variable winds the ship off and on. Spoke and gamed with the fore and main land several other sails in sight. A heavy swell hindered from the N.W. which makes landing on the Island impossible, saw grampus and so ends

Saturday September 7th
The first part calm and light breeze from N.W. Several sails in sight at sunset the Island of Corraige 6.12 miles distant. The middle part the off and on the latter part the ship off and at Santa Cruz with a fresh breeze from N.W. the captain on shore after securing and so ends
