

Saturday November 2nd
Lat 33° 43' Long 81° 11' W. Cloudy most of this day with
light variable winds. The ship hove to under short sail the middle
part heading to S. E. The first and latter parts the ship heading
to S. E. One sail in sight. And so ends

Sunday November 3rd
No Port. This day commences with light breeze from
S. E. The ship heading to S. E. by the wind. At 4 P. M. the
light sails of fresh breeze from the same quarter. At 8
set shortened sail for the night the middle and latter parts
strong gales from S. E. The ship hove to under short
reef. Main top sail and on both tacks during the time
One sail in sight. And so ends

Monday November 4th
Lat 34° 38' Long 81° 36' W. Strong gales all the day
with squalls of rain. The ship hove to under reefed main top
sail and storm staysails. And on both tacks during the day the
wind from S. E. One sail in sight. And so ends

Tuesday November 5th
Lat 35° 58' Long 81° 33' W. Clear most of this day
with fresh breeze from S. E. The middle part of the middle
the latter part light breezes from S. E. spoke the S. E. wind
The ship steered by the wind all day and on both tacks during
the time. And so ends

Wednesday November 6th
Lat 33° 20' Long 80° 51' W. Fine weather all the day
with light breezes from S. E. The ship heading to S. Most of the
day. Several sails in sight. And so ends

Thursday November 7th
Lat 34° 40' Long 81° 02' W. Clear weather all this
day with light breezes from S. E. The middle
and latter parts strong breezes. The ship steered by the wind
and on both tacks during the day. One sail in sight
and so ends

Friday November 8th
Lat 33° 32' Long 80° 49' W. This day commences with fresh
gales from S. E. The ship hove to and on both tacks during the
day. The middle and latter parts strong gales. And a hanged
and so ends

Saturday November 9th
No Port. Strong gales all this day from S. E. with
very heavy sea running. The ship heading to S. E. every thing
furled but the mizzen stay sail. And so ends

Sunday November 10th
No Port. Strong gales from S. E. with a very heavy sea running
until 7 A. M. it then lulled the ship hove to heading to S. E. At 10 A. M. the
wind hauled to W. and then to S. in a few minutes and commenced blowing
again harder than ever. The ship heading to S. E. And so ends

Monday November 11th
No Port. Strong gales the first part from S. E. with a very
heavy sea. The middle part fresh gales from the same quarter. The
ship hove to heading to S. E. The latter part strong breezes from
S. E. At 1 P. M. kept off to S. W. by word made sail and so ends

Tuesday November 12th
Lat 34° 34' Long 81° 09' W. Clear weather with fresh
breezes from S. E. The first and middle parts the ship heading
to S. E. The first part, and S. E. The middle part the latter part
light breezes from S. E. The ship steered by the wind and on
both tacks during the time. One sail in sight. And so ends

Wednesday November 13th
Lat 34° 06' Long 81° 47' W. Clear weather all this day with
light variable winds. The ship heading various course during the day
but to S. E. Most of the time several sails in sight. And so
ends

Thursday November 14th
Lat 34° 00' Long 81° 22' W. Fine weather all this day
with good breezes from S. E. to N. E. The ship heading
to S. E. The first and latter parts the middle part sailing
with the main yard aback. One sail in sight
