Lat 26° 30' W. Long 142° 38' W. Strong breeze, the
first part with a little rain. The wind S.E. W. The middle
and latter part to E. wind, with light breeze from W. The
ship heading a number of courses during the day.
Cooking Islands in sight. The watch employed in
ship's duty and sounds off at 11 P.M. 21st

Thursday May 21st
No. 100. Fine weather all the day with calms
and light variable winds. The ship on both tack during
the day and heading a number of courses. Bonin
Islands in sight and sounds

Friday May 22nd
No Obs. #. Fine weather all this day with light
variable winds. The ship heading a number of fagots during
the day. Cruising Bonin Islands in sight to the west.
A.M. saw 4 Tail. And so on.

Saturday May 23rd
No breeze. Fine weather all the day with light
breezes from N.E. The ship cruising off the Bonin's. The
latter part off and on at Pals Island and got a number
of rocks, oysters and a hog skinned hump backs and seals.
The second Mate and on man returned today.

The second mail and on mail returned, today
 Sunday May 24th.
 No Chet + fine weather all the day with light breeze
 from E. by S. ship steered by the wind most of the time
 and on both tacks during the day. Baloy Island in sight
 25 miles distant. And so ends

Monday May 25th
No Che. & fine weather all the day with light
breezes from S.W. The ship started by the wind. The first
and middle parts heading to S. the latter part to N.W.
The sail on Bonin Islands in sight. Plenty of fire-works
around. And sounds of cannon.

Tuesday May 26th
 No Chy. & fine weather all the day, with light
 breeze from S. & E. to S. & W. Course by N. E. the first part.
 There is grouping in sight. Spoke the ship Janus of
 New Bedford the Middle part & came W. N. W. the
 latter N. W. All sail out. Our sick man off duty again

Wednesday May 27th
No Over-~~cast~~ ^{clear} weather all this day with light
breeze from S. E. by the ship heading to W. N. W. A. M.
saw ~~several~~ ^{one} whales got ready to lower. And so ends

Thursday May 28th
Sat 29th of M. Long 40 is & fine weather all this
day with light breeze from S. W. At 1 P.M. lowered for
tallow and fish and got a whale. got them along
side at 11 P.M. & day light commenced cutting and at 11
A.M. had the men & all hands employed in clearing up
and so ends

Friday May 29th
Left 2nd is N. Logue 13440 Fine weather all the day
with light breeze from the S.W. steered by the wind and on
both tacks during the day. Arrived And. Loends
