

Tuesday January 19th
Lat 42° 30' Long 108° 00' M. Fine weather
all this day with light trades the ship headed
to the southward under short sail boiling the
Libernia in sight and so ends

Wednesday January 20th
Lat 42° 00' Long 108° 15' M. Fine weather all this
day with light trades the ship steered by the wind and
on different tacks during the day the Libernia in
sight finished boiling at 10 P.M. The latter part
the watch employed in breaking out shoals and
so ends

Thursday January 21st
Lat 41° 30' Long 108° 45' M. Fine weather all
this day with light trades the ship steered by the
wind and on different tacks during the day P.M.
spoke the Libernia the latter part all hands employed
in storing down oil and so ends

Friday January 22nd
Lat 41° 00' Long 109° 00' M. Fine weather
all this day with light trades the ship steered by
the wind and on different tacks during the day
the Cooper at work setting up shoals and so ends

Saturday January 23rd
Lat 40° 30' Long 109° 30' M. Fine weather all
this day with very light trades the ship steered by
the wind and on different tacks during the day
at 10 P.M. saw a sperm whale going quick towards
shore after saw a lone whale going the same way
but it turned and went to leeward downed and chased
him a while and he went to windward and over soon
out of sight the Cooper at work setting up shoals
and so ends

Sunday January 24th
Lat 40° 00' Long 109° 00' M. Fine weather
all this day with very light trades the ship steered by the
wind and on different tacks during the day

Monday January 25th
Lat 40° 00' Long 108° 30' M. Fine weather all this
day with light trades the ship steered by the wind
and on different tacks during the day the latter part
all hands employed in storing down oil and so ends

Tuesday January 26th
No Obv. Fine weather all this day with light
trades the ship steered by the wind and on different
tacks during the day all hands employed the first part
in stowing down oil finished at dark stowing down
oil in all the latter part the Cooper at work repairing
casks and so ends

Wednesday January 27th
Lat 40° 00' Long 108° 00' M. Fine weather all this
day with light trades the ship steered by the wind and
on different tacks during the day the Cooper at work
repairing casks and so ends

Thursday January 28th
Lat 40° 00' Long 108° 00' M. Fine weather all this
day with light trades at 2 P.M. the ship headed to N.W. by
the wind. Saw sperm whales, found for them and
the barboard boat struck got the whale dead and along
side at sun set the middle part the ship steered by the
wind and on different tacks the latter part hauled
aback and cut the whale in and so ends

Friday January 29th
Lat 40° 00' Long 108° 00' M. Fine weather all this
day with light trades the ship steered by the wind
and on different tacks boiling the Cooper at
work setting up shoals and so ends
