of this day with moderate breezes from E. course W. by S.
All day all drawing sails set. And so ends

Monday May 3rd
Lat 21 10 N Long 152 33 Clear weather most
of this day with moderate breezes from E. course W. by S.
drawing sails set the cooper at work setting up shooks
The watch employed in ships duty and so ends

Tuesday May 4th
Lat 21 36 N Long 153 59 Clear weather all this
day with light breezes from E. course W. by S. All day
sails set the cooper at work setting up shooks, the watch
employed in ships duty and so ends

Wednesday May 5th
Lat 22 07 N Long 155 24 Clear weather all
this day with light breezes from E. course W. by S. All
day all drawing sails set the cooper at work setting up
shooks the watch employed in ships duty and so ends

Thursday May 6th
Lat 22 15 N Long 156 27 W light breezes all this
day from E with light rain squalls course W. by S. All sail
set the watch employed in ships duty and so ends

Friday May 7th
Lat 22 40 N Long 159 49 Clear weather most
of this day with a light breeze from E. S. The first part
the middle and latter part a fresh breeze from E. course
W. by N. All sail out and so ends

Saturday May 8th
Lat 23 10 N Long 162 50 Clear weather the
first and middle part with fresh breeze from E. W. S.
The latter part strong breeze from
E. to S. W. handed in and double reefed the topsails
and handed the courses, raining hard course N. W.
all day

Sunday May 9th
Lat 25 10 N Long 164 14 Clear weather part of the
day fresh breeze from S. W. W. by S. The ship heading
E. by N. and on different tacks. The middle part
more moderate made some sail the wind from W. The latter
part fine weather course W. by N. All sail out and so
ends

Monday May 10th
Smoked weather all this day with light breezes
N. to N. E. The ship heading to N. W. by N. at 4 P. M.
saw the Bonaparte Islands bearing to N. E. by E. and made
for them the latter part of and on Seal Island the
captain on shore saw hump backs and so ends

Tuesday May 11th
No Obey the ship off and at Seal Island until
three P. M. the captain then came off with a lot of onions
and left off to N. W. course N. W. the remainder of the
day with light breeze from E. S. to S. and so ends

Wednesday May 12th
Lat 24 19 N Long 170 00 Smoked the first
part with light breeze from E. to S. W. course N. W. by E.
N. at sunset shortened sail for the night the middle
part fresh breeze from E. S. The ship hove to head
yards aback. The latter part of day and evening with
light breezes from E. S. W. The ship heading to N. E. and
so ends

Thursday May 13th
Lat 24 20 N Long 170 00 Clear all this
day with calm and light variable winds the ship
cleared a number of courses during the day the latter
part spoke the Brig William C. Allen

Friday May 14th
No Obey Rainy with light rains from N. the
first part the middle part and latter part of good breeze
from N. E. W. The ship steered by the wind and on
different tacks during the day. Two sails were set
the watch employed in ships duty and so ends
