in sight ahead at 10 A.M. hauled black of the Island
and the Captain went on shore trading and so on

Monday September 2nd
No Obert. squally and rainy all this day with
variable winds. The ship off the Island got off at 10 o'clock
on p. o. r. i. t. e. The first part the middle and latter part being
hard and so on.

Thursday September 1st
No. 10. Rainy with a light breeze from the
first part the land in sight to the mid watch. The middle
part calm the latter part clear weather with light
breeze from N. The ship heading to S. All sail set. The
land in sight and scenes

Wednesday September 8th
No Obv. Fine weather. The first part with light
breezes from NW. The ship off. Wilington Island. Cab of the
back loaded. Casamats. And 32 Hogs And a lot of other
stuff. In middle and latter part heading to the westward
for mention the latter part the Island in sight and so
ends

Thursday September
Equally with rain at 12 M. M. G. & Pilot and at
Three M. came to anchor in the W. W. Harbor of
Obdjection the latter part of the hands employed in
setting' masts and downes

Friday September 20th
Boying the first part the middle and latter
parts pleasant get off and stowed a raft of water for
so ends

Saturday September 11
One watch on liberty. The being Sunday on shore
towed and dried the sails and hauled them again. And so
end

Sunday September 2^d
All hands employed in getting wood, water and
yams and board And so ends

Monday September 8th
All hands employed in getting wood water and
recruited on board and painting ship. John Bonnard
Seage Goguin departed.

Tuesday September 14th
All hands employed in getting wood and
water And so on

Wednesday September 19th
 She worked on like yesterday. The Thor employed in
 getting off wood and slowing it away. Fredrick Cimb
 and Christopher Riley departed.

Thursday September 16th
One watch on liberty the other employed in
g string affairs. Two of the depots returned Fredrick
Kimbald and Christopher Bailey.

Friday September 17th
One watch on Liberty the other employed in
getting off wood and stowing it away

Saturday September 18th
All hands on board. The first part got off some
wood and stored it away. The latter part got under weigh
with a light breeze from N. E. and stood out sea. The
ship clear of the land headed to the N. E. by the wind
shipped three natives And so end.

Sunday September 19th
The first part high buoy from E. S. C. The ship
heading N.W. The middle part calm. The latter part high
buoy from N.W. Sound. O. M. sail out. A. M. sail in.
Sail out. And so on.
