 the masts and fore top mast stay sails the latter part
 a fine breeze from E.S.E. sperm whales in sight to wind

Friday October 8th
 Lat 49° 2' Long 165° 54' Clear weather with fresh
 breezes from E.S.E. to E.N.E. The ship steered by the wind
 and on different tacks during the day. heading from
 N.E. to N. E. Topgallant sail in. Crest of the flag returned
 to duty

Saturday October 9th
 Lat 71° 05' Long 162° 41' Clear weather all
 the day with fresh breezes from N.E. & E. The ship steered
 by the wind the first part heading to N.E. & E. from middle
 part course E. by S. the latter part E. Adana Jones
 off duty with a very bad hand and so ends

Sunday October 10th
 Lat 5° 06' Long 163° 30' Fine weather with
 a fresh breeze from N.E. & E. all the day. Course E.N.E.
 sail out and so ends

Monday October 11th
 Lat 6° 00' Long 165° 00' Fine weather all the
 day with a light breeze from N.E. & E. the first part
 the middle and latter parts fresh breezes N.E. & E.
 & S. by S. by N. The watch employed in
 repairing the fore sail and so ends

Tuesday October 12th
 Lat 7° 45' Long 164° 29' Clear breezes from
 N.E. & E. the day with rain squalls the ship heading
 E. by N. the first part the middle part home to
 head wind and back the latter part course E.N.E.
 and so ends

Wednesday October 13th
 Lat 8° 30' Long 165° 20' Fine weather with
 fresh breezes from E.S.E. the first part. At 4 P.M.
 the ship off towards Island and the cones came
 off bringing a lot of pitch and coconuts which the
 captain bought the middle and latter parts
 the ship heading to the southward by the wind
 the

Thursday October 14th
 Lat 9° 38' Long 162° 51' Fine weather all the
 day with light breezes from E.S.E. The ship heading
 to the southward by the wind at 4 P.M. Adana Jones
 whales lowered and the foreboard and board were
 hauled truck the foreboard run turned the other cup
 the middle part home to. The latter part and
 the whales in and stood to N.E. & E. by the wind
 and in sight to N.E. and so ends

Friday October 15th
 Lat 9° 40' Long 162° 30' Fine weather all
 the day with a good breeze from E.S.E. The ship steered
 by the wind and on different tacks during the day
 Boiling. land in sight to N. and so ends

Saturday October 16th
 Lat 9° 54' Long 162° 42' Fine weather all
 the day with fresh breezes from E.S.E. the ship heading
 to the southward by the wind finished boiling the first part
 the Island of St. Crustal in sight to E.S.E.
 and so ends

Sunday October 17th
 Lat 10° 41' Long 162° 04' Fresh breezes from
 E.S.E. with rain squalls the ship heading E. by N.
 the wind. The light sail in and so ends
