Sunday January 24th
Lat 32° 20' Long 179° 07' No Ob. Fine weather
all this day with light breeze from E. S. E. The ship
heading to S. and S. E. all day One sail in
sight And so ends

Monday January 25th
Lat 32° 40' Long 178° 45' No Ob. Fine weather the
first and middle parts the latter part smoky the
wind light from E. the ship heading to S. E. all day
The wind most of the day and two sails. One sail
rock in sight the latter part And so ends

Tuesday January 26th
Lat 31° 40' Long 178° 15' No Ob. Foggy most of the
day with calms and light breeze from different quarters
the ship cruising round French rocks the compass rose
spring up shocks And so ends

Wednesday January 26th
Lat 31° 29' Long 178° 41' No Ob. Clear and calm
all this day French rock in sight the water humped
ed in sight duty And so ends. Monks Megal
sails returned to ship

Thursday January 27th
No Ob. Clear weather most of the day with
light air from different quarters the ship heading
to S. E. all day French rock Curtis rocks and
Loat Island in sight during the day the paneled the
spank and bent a new main stay sail And so ends

Friday January 28th
No Ob. Fine weather all this day with heavy
light breezes from S. E. Cruising Curtis rock and
Loat Island in sight to the eastward And so
ends

Saturday January 29th
No Ob. Fine weather all this day with
light breezes from E. the ship headed by the wind
and on different tacks during the day Loat Island
and Curtis rocks in sight And so ends

Sunday January 30th
Lat 30° 16' Long 178° 55' No Ob. Cloudy with rain
in the middle and latter parts the wind light all
day and from E. S. E. Loat Island and Curtis rocks
in sight the first part the ship steamed by the
wind and on different tacks during the day

Monday January 31st
Lat 30° 40' Long 178° 55' No Ob. Rainy the first
and middle and part of the latter the wind light
from N. E. E. to N. the ship heading to the west
ward most of the time parted the mizen top
mast back stay & spliced and put them up again

Tuesday February 1st
Lat 30° 40' Long 179° 35' The first part fine
weather with light variable air and calms at 1 P. M.
saw a sperm whale going quick & N. hounded but
could not get on. The middle part raining hard
with light variable air the latter part strong breeze
from E. and a plenty of rain the ship heading
to S. E. saw a sperm whale but they soon went out
of sight in the rain

Wednesday February 2nd
No Ob. Rainy most of this day with
moderate gales from E. E. the first part the ship
heading to S. under easy sail the middle and
latter parts strong gales from E. E. the ship
have to under close reef main top sail heading
to S. And so ends

Thursday February 3rd
No Ob. Rainy all this day with
fresh gales from E. E. to N. E. the ship have
to on different tacks, lat of an And so ends
