Saturday February 5th
Lat 31 33 Long 178 04 W. The first and
middle parts strong breezes from S.E. with main
squalts. The latter part clear with moderate gales
from the same quarter. The ship heading to N.E. all
day. The water employed in repairing the jib
and so ends

Sunday February 6th
Lat 30 55 Long 179 25 W. Clear weather
with moderate gales from E. The first and
middle parts. The latter part strong breeze from
the same quarter. The ship steered by the wind
and on different tacks during the day

Monday February 7th
Lat 30 00 Long 179 54 E. Clear weather most
of this day with strong breezes from S. and a heavy
swell on the ship. The wind shifted S.W. sails
steered by the wind and on different tacks during
the day. Repaired the main top gallant sail and
so ends

Tuesday February 8th
Lat 30 50 Long 179 46 E. Smoky all this
day with very strong breezes from E. The ship
steered by the wind and on different tacks
during the day

Wednesday February 9th
Lat 30 52 Long 179 57 E. Smoky all the
day with strong breezes from E. The ship steered
by the wind and on both tacks during the
day

Thursday February 10th
Lat 30 24 Long 179 63 W. Clear weather all
this day with strong breezes from E. The first and
middle parts. The latter part fresh breezes from the
same quarter. The ship steered by the wind and on
different tacks during the day

Friday February 11th
Lat 30 50 Long 179 40 W. Clear weather all this
day with light breezes from E. to S.E. W. Sperm whales
in sight lowered and got a small one, with sperm
before sunset. The middle part forced by the wind
and on different tacks. The latter part chasing
whales again and so ends

Saturday 12th
Lat 30 40 Long 179 46 E. Clear weather all
this day with light breezes from N.W. E. The first and
middle parts. The latter part calm, at 1 P.M. sperm
whales in sight lowered and got a small one. Cut
him in the latter part. Calling the one that we
got yesterday and so ends

Sunday February 13th
Lat 30 52 Long 179 41 E. Clear weather all this
day with light breezes from from E. to N. The ship
steered by the wind and on different tacks during
the day. A.M. finished baling

Monday February 14th
Lat 30 46 Long 179 00 E. Clear weather with
very light breeze from E. to N. The first and middle
parts. The latter part calm, at day light N. wind sperm
whales lowered and got one, got him to the ship
at 1 P.M. And lowered again and got another. And
so ends

Tuesday February 15th
Lat 30 20 Long 180 02 E. Clear weather all this
day with light breeze from E. to N. The first
part baling and cut in the other whale,
