

Sunday, March 13th
Lat 30° 30' Long 179° 50' Clear weather all
this day with fresh breezes from E. The ship steered
by the wind and on different tacks. At 2 P.M.
saw two ships chasing whales, lowered for them
at 4 P.M. and got three small whales. Put them in
the latter part, then sails in sight during the

Monday, March 14th
Lat 31° 10' Long 179° 30' Clear weather all
this day with light breezes from E. to E.S.E. The ship
heading to southward by the wind all day. Boiling
coupling and stowing down sail and so on.

Tuesday, March 15th
Lat 32° 30' Long 179° 38' Clear weather all
this day with fresh breezes from E. The ship steered
by the wind and on different tacks. All hands
employed in boiling and stowing down sail. At 11 A.M.
picked up a stinker and cut him in. Several sails
in sight.

Wednesday, March 16th
No other strong breezes from E. all this day
with light rain squalls. Several sails in sight.
Spoke bark John Maury. The ship steered by the
wind and heading to N.E. Boiling and so on.

Thursday, March 17th
Lat 33° 10' Long 179° 48' Clear weather all this day with
strong breezes from E. The ship on different tacks
during the day by the wind. Cut up ropes in sight.
At 8 P.M. also one sail in sight. Finished boiling the
first part the latter part all hands employed
in coupling and stowing down sail and so on.

Friday, March 18th
Lat 30° 30' Long 179° 50' Clear weather all
this day from E. with strong breeze. All hands
employed the first part looking down sail. The latter
part in sight cutting a whale. The ship steered
by the wind and on different tacks and so on.

Saturday, March 19th
Lat 30° 30' Long 179° 50' Clear weather all this
day with strong breezes from E. The ship steered by the
wind and on different tacks during the day. The latter
part stowing down sail several sails in sight.

Sunday, March 20th
No other strong breezes from E. all this day.
Spoke bark Siverack. Several other
sails in sight. The ship steered by the wind and on
different tacks during the day.

Monday, March 21st
Lat 30° 30' Long 179° 15' Clear weather all this
day with strong breezes from E. The ship steered various
courses during the day. Cruising several sails in sight.
Spoke bark Boone and Siverack. Repaired the fore sail
and so on.

Tuesday, March 22nd
Lat 31° 00' Long 179° 45' Clear weather all
this day with fresh breezes from E. The ship steered
various courses during the day. Cruising several sails
in sight. Saw one cutting in a whale. The cooper at
work setting up shooks.

Wednesday, March 23rd
Lat 31° 10' Long 179° 48' Clear weather most
of this day with fresh breezes from E. The ship steered
various courses. Cruising several sails in sight. The cooper
at work setting up shooks. And so on.

Thursday, March 24th
Lat 31° 30' Long 179° 49' B. squally most
of this day with strong breezes from E. to S.E. The
ship steered various courses during the day. One sail
in sight. At 8 P.M. repaired the main
sail and so on.

Friday, March 25th
Lat 32° 30' Long 179° 41' Clear weather with
fresh gales from E. S.E. all day. The ship has to
undress and reefed main top sail heading to
southward and so on.
