

Friday April 8th
Lat 32° 28' Long 178° 49' W. Clear weather all
this day with light breezes from the first part
the ship heading to the middle and latter
parts. Calm One sail in sight and so ends

Saturday April 9th
Lat 32° 03' Long 179° 14' W. Clear weather
and calm all this day. One sail in sight. The
watch employed in washing ship and so ends

Sunday April 10th
Lat 32° 13' Long 179° 52' W. Clear and calm
the first part the middle part clear with light
breezes from S.W. Course S.W. the latter fresh
breezes from N.W. with light rain squalls course
N.W. two sails in sight and so ends

Monday April 11th
At 0600 squally the first part with
a fresh breeze from N.W. The ship heading to
S.W. by the wind. The middle and latter parts
clear with light breezes from the same quarter.
The ship steered by the wind and on different
tacks. Spoke ship Europa & washed sail in
sight and so ends

Tuesday April 12th
At 0600 fine clear weather all this day
with light variable winds. The ship heading to
S.W. The watch employed in ship's duty and
so ends

Wednesday April 13th
Lat 32° 05' Long 178° 41' W. Clear weather all
this day with light variable winds from the westward
and the ship steered by the wind and on different tacks
working to westward. And so ends

Thursday April 14th
Lat 32° 35' Long 178° 40' W. Clear weather all this
day with light breezes from the N.W. to S.W. Course
S.W. by S. and so ends

Friday April 15th
Lat 32° 12' Long 178° 26' W. Squally with strong
breezes from S.E. the first part double reefed. The top
sails course S.W. by S. The middle and latter parts
strong gales from the same quarter. Blasted reefed
and hauled the courses at one A.M. more ship and
have to heading to S.E. by N. At 8 A.M. headed to
again and so ends

Saturday April 16th
Lat 32° 45' Long 178° 28' W. Strong gales and
clear weather all this day. The wind S.W. The ship
have to heading to S.E. by N. And so ends

Sunday April 17th
At 0600 fresh gales from N.W. the first
part the ship have to heading to S.E. by N. The
middle part more moderate you to S and made
sail. The latter part fresh breezes from S.E.
The ship heading to Cape Breton in sight and
so ends

Monday April 18th
Clear weather all this day. The ship
heading in for the harbor of Russell Bay of Colorado
saw the anchor at 6 P.M. The latter part all
hands employed in getting water and washing
ship and so ends

Tuesday April 19th
All hands employed in getting water and
painting ship. Discharged fore men

Wednesday April 20th
Fine weather all hands employed in
getting and stowing water and so ends

Thursday April 21st
Fine weather all this day with all
hands employed in getting water and stowing
in. And so ends
