The first part got a few fish and goods. Sold 5 bbls
salt & the middle part heading to S by the wind
The latter part to E. & And so ends

March 1st
Wednesday February 29th
Lat 33 54 Long 79 48 W Fine weather all this
day with light breezes from N.W. Course to N. & S.
until 10 P.M. head yards about the remainder of
the night. The latter part off and on at Juan
Hernandez And so ends

March 2nd
Thursday February 30th
No Over time weather all this day with
light breezes from S.W. The ship off and on at
Juan Hernandez. The first part got off some
potatoes. The middle and latter parts Course to
E. & And so ends

Friday March 3rd
Lat 33 47 Long 79 48 W Fine weather all this
day with light breezes from S.W. Course to E. & S.
Day, A.M. repaired the fore top sail And so
ends

Saturday March 4th
Lat 33 16 Long 79 52 W Fine weather all
this day with light breezes from S.W. Course
to E. & S. The first and middle parts The latter part
by the wind to N.W. & Choke bark morning
dinner. And the sail in sight. plenty of fish
And so ends

Sunday March 5th
Lat 33 16 Long 80 00 W Fine weather all this
day with light breezes from N.W. The ship steered
by the wind and heading to N.W. The first
part Choke bark. Morseland morning star
The middle and latter part by the wind or
light breeze to N.W. At 9 A.M. saw a few whales
The morning star in company. Mated and
loaded in the whales And so ends

Monday March 6th
Lat 33 38 Long 80 23 W Fine weather all this
day with light breezes from N.W. At 1 P.M. One of the
Morning Star boats struck a large whale and
got stuck. All hands went in. And the whale struck
another boat. Turned him up. The latter part
got the head from the Morning Star And got it
in. Several sails in sight And so ends

Tuesday March 7th
Lat 33 20 Long 80 40 W Fine weather with light
variable winds And a heavy swell on the ship heading
in all directions during the day. Bailing the latter part
finished bailing and cleared up deck. Three sails in
sight And so ends

Wednesday March 8th
Lat 33 33 Long 80 58 W Clear weather most
of this day with light variable winds. The ship steered
various courses during the day. Cruising. Several
sails in sight. The watch employed in ship duty. And
so ends

Thursday March 9th
Lat 33 42 Long 81 44 W Overcast most of this day
with light breeze from N.W. The first and middle parts
The latter part fresh breezes from the same quarter
The ship various courses during the day. A number
of sails close five haws and And so ends

Friday March 10th
Lat 33 40 Long 82 00 W Strong breezes and
squally. The first and middle parts The wind N.W. &
Choke bark morning star Several other sails in sight
The latter part light breezes from S.W. with a very
heavy swell on And so ends

Saturday March 11th
Lat 33 12 Long 84 31 W Clear weather most
of this day with light breezes from S.W. The ship
steered by the wind and on different tack during the
day. Several sails in sight. The latter part full moon
employed solving board. Steamed 34 bbls 12 gals
