

Saturday March 25th
Lat 35° 38' S Long 74° 48' W Fine weather all
day with light breezes from N.W. All the day with rain in the
middle part. The ship steered by the wind
and several different tacks during the day. And now
short sail. Several sails in sight. plenty of
fin backs around. And so ends.

Sunday March 26th
Lat 35° 38' S Long 74° 48' W Moderate gales all
this day from N.E. The ship had to undergo short
sail and different tacks during the day. Several
sails in sight. And so ends.

Monday March 27th
Lat 35° 35' S Long 74° 48' W Moderate gales from
N.E. To the first and middle part. The latter part
calm and very heavy swell on. Several sails in
sight. And so ends. The ship heading to N.E.

Tuesday March 28th
Lat 35° 35' S Long 74° 48' W Fine weather all
this day with light breezes from N.E. The
ship heading to N.E. By the wind and
1 P.M. saw sperm whale to windward leaving
quite close. A few sails in sight. Chased them half
with the ship the remainder of the day. And
so ends.

Wednesday March 29th
Lat 35° 33' S Long 74° 40' W Fine weather all
this day with light breeze from E. The ship
heading to S.E. At 1 P.M. lowered boat for whale
and the whale struck and got 4 whales. The middle
part heading to S.E. whale along side. The latter
part cut him in open a sail in sight. Lots of
black fish and fin backs around. And so ends.

Thursday March 30th
Lat 35° 33' S Long 74° 48' W Fine weather all
this day with light breezes from S.E. To W.S.W. The ship
heading to N.E. To the first part. The middle and latter
parts from S.E. To S. Several sails in sight. Boiling
all the day. And so ends.

Friday March 31st
Lat 35° 34' S Long 74° 48' W Fine weather all the
day with light breezes from S.E. To W.N.E. The
wind shifted, boiling at 3 A.M. The ship was turned
up to the S. Several sails in sight. Black fish round.

Saturday April 1st
Lat 35° 29' S Long 74° 52' W Fine weather the first
part with light breezes from N.W. course. Of several sails
in sight. The middle and latter parts light breeze from
W.S.W. The ship heading to N.E. Spoke back M.D.
Waleson. And had again, foggy and so ends.

Sunday April 2nd
No clear chick and rainy. Calm the first part.
The middle and latter parts light breeze from N.E.
To S.E. The ship steered by the wind and on
different tacks during the day. Few sails in sight
and so ends.

Monday April 3^d
Lat 35° 35' S Long 75° 06' W Fine weather all the day
with light breezes from N.E. The first and middle parts
The ship heading to N.E. The first To 70° 08' S. The
middle and latter parts. The latter part all hands
employed in stowing oil. Stowed 65 barrels. Fresh meat
from L. And in sight. S.D. Mares And so ends.

Tuesday April 4th
Lat 35° 35' S Long 75° 04' W Fine weather all the
day with light breezes from N.E. The ship heading to E.S.
unfortunately sent her topgallant. The middle part
heading to N.E. By the wind. The latter part heading
to S. for Salcahuana. Not ready to go to And so
ends. Yesterday At 9 A.M. Mr. Smith came to board
Salcahuana. And handled the ship. And so ends.
