

Wednesday April 26th
No Ob. Since then weather all this day
with fresh breezes from S.E. The ship steered
by the wind and heading from S.W. to S.E.
All sail, John Barber off duty and so
ends

Thursday April 27th
Lat 38° 10' Long 80° 47' Clear weather most
of this day with fresh breezes from S.E. The ship
steered by the wind and heading from S.W. to S.E.
All sail out. The watch employed in taring up
sheathing off the deck, and so ends

Friday April 28th
Lat 38° 06' Long 81° 27' Overcast most of this
day with light breezes from S.E. The ship steered
by the wind and heading to S.W. to S.E. All
sail out and so ends

Saturday April 29th
Lat 39° 46' Long 80° 27' W. Overcast most
of this day with light breeze from S.E. The first
part of the ship heading S. The middle part calms
The latter part light breeze from W. to N. Course
S. to E. All sail out and so ends

Sunday April 30th
Lat 40° 11' Long 82° 44' W. This day commences with
light breezes from W. to N. and overcast. The middle part
thunder. The latter part fresh breezes from the same
quarter and foggy Course S. to E. All day All sail out
and so ends

Monday May 1st
Lat 41° 50' Long 82° 10' W. Fresh breezes from
N.W. and thick fog Course S. to E. All day All sail
out. Ripped up the sheathing on the deck and threw it
on board and so ends John Barber returns
to duty

Tuesday May 2nd
Lat 44° 41' Long 82° 00' W. Fresh weather the first and
middle part with strong breezes from N.W. to N. Course S. to E.
all possible sail out. The latter part the wind hauled to
S.W. then double reefed and courses and so ends
heading S. to E. with a moderate gale and so ends

Wednesday May 3rd
No Ob. High and rainy all this day with
strong breezes from S. The first part the ship heading
S.W. The middle part from S. to E. to N. Course
S. to E. All sail out and so ends

Thursday May 4th
No Ob. Fresh gales from W. all this day with
fog and rain and a heavy sea on. Course S. to E. Under
double reefed top sails and fore sail. S. to W. and so
ends

Friday May 5th
No Ob. This day commences with fresh gales
from W. and thick weather At 2 P.M. handed fore sail
and close reefed the top sail. Course S. to E. At 4 P.M.
The wind hauled to N.W. and blowed grate guns. Handed
the fore top sail and hove to heading to S.W. & heavy
sea on and so ends

Saturday May 6th
No Ob. Strong gales from W. The first part
Course S. to W. and two close reefed top sails at 7 P.M.
handed fore top sail The middle part blowing grate
guns and a very heavy sea on. At 11 P.M. handed main top sail
ship hove to heading to S.W. shipped a sea that stone
in galley window and broke forward lower part of boat
and hooked of gunnery sail and done other slight damage
The latter part more moderate. The wind hauled
to N.W. set double reefed top sails and courses. Course
S. to E. by S. A heavy sea on and so ends
