

Wednesday 8

This day commences with light winds and variable and squally weather middle and later part the same the crew vainly employed so ends this day

Thursday 9

This day commences with light winds middle part the same later part strong crew vainly employed in ship duty steering by the wind on the Western tack

Friday 10

This day commences with a strong breeze from the west middle and later part the same the crew vainly employed so ends this day steering by the wind on the N. tack

Saturday 11

This day commences with a strong westerly wind middle part light later part calm some ice in sight so ends the day steering by the wind on the Northern tack. Lat. 58.10

Sunday 12

This day commences with strong breeze from the N. E middle and later part the same at four A. M. raised the land Hoar islands sixty miles distance saw several strips of ice saw a dead fish steering by the wind on the N. tack. Lat 60.13

Monday 13

This day commences with a strong gale from the N. E ship under short sail middle and later part the same saw several strips of ice so ends this day steering by the wind on the N. tack Lat 61.10

Tuesday 14

This day commences with a strong breeze from the N middle and later part the same so ends this day steering by the wind on the N. tack at two p. m. one ship and stood to the N

Lat. 61.40

Wednesday 15

This day commences with a strong breeze from the N. E. and fine weather middle and later part the same plenty.

This day commences with a strong wind and fine weather middle and later part the same lowered the boats for whales in vain in catching them in plenty of ice in sight

Thursday 16

This day commences with a light S. wind middle and later part the same lowered the boats for whales but no success crew employed in flogging blubber so ends this day plenty of ice

Saturday June 1. 1872

This day commences with a light S. wind and thick weather middle part the same later part strong breeze at six p. m. crossed anchor with the port bow in under patches of water plenty of natives on board so ends this day in flower Bay

Sunday 2

This day commences with a calm and fine weather middle and later part the same at seven A. M. took out anchor a number of canoes came on board so ends this day

Monday 3

This day commences with a strong E. wind middle part the same later part calm at eight A. M. took out anchor and made sail crew employed in muzzing blubber and started the tryworks so ends this day steering Wby. S

Tuesday 4

This day commences with a light E. wind middle part the same later part wind hauled to N. and thick weather land in sight crew employed in ship duty so ends this day

Wednesday 5

This day commences with a thick fog middle part the same later part strong breeze at nine A. M. lowered the boats for whales but no success at six p. m. lowered the boats again the Starboard boat struck took him along side and commenced cutting got through cutting at six the next morning no sail in sight
