

Peop Cape

Under way and made slow progress to N. spoke the Andea three ships in sight at eight pm dropped the port Boat Board in seven fathoms of water natives came on board hauled a boat to go in shore

Thursday 25

This day commences with a strong S. W. wind fine weather middle and later part the same at nine A. M. got under way at ten A. M. dropped anchor in five fathoms of water crew employed in minding lubber gained the Andea three ships in sight

Friday 26

This day commences with a strong S. wind and thick weather middle and later clear with a light wind at one pm got under way and made slow progress to the N. at six P. M. dropped the port bow in five fathoms of water started the try works three ships in sight

Saturday 27

This day commences with a light S. E. W. and thick rainy weather middle part the same later part strong N. W. wind at nine A. M. got under and stood in and dropped the port Bow in five fathoms of water at two pm got under way and commenced working to the windward three ships in sight

Sunday 28

This day commences with a light N. W. and thick weather middle and later part clear at eight A. M. got under dropped the Port Bow in five fathoms of water gained the R. W. Word

Monday 29

This day commences with a light S. W. wind and fine weather middle and later part the same at nine A. M. hauled and and picked up a stick took him along side and commenced cutting crew employed in stowing down and trying out

Tuesday 30

This day commences with a light S. W. wind and fine weather middle and later part the same at nine A. M. got under way at ten A. M. dropped the port bow in five fathoms of water employed in scraping base three ships in sight all natives came

Wednesday 31

This day commences with a calm middle part the same later part light E. wind crew employed in stowing down a new a main top sail several natives came on through the day seven ships in sight with the wreck ships

Thursday August 1st 1813

This day commences with calm middle and later part the same at eight A. M. got under way and hauled along side of a cake of ice and got some water secured two boats in the ice but no success crew employed in working ship sixteen ships in sight spoke the Andea three ships of new London

August 2

This day commences with a thick fog middle and later part clear crew employed in getting boats saw the James Allen got my box of Port sixteen ships in sight

Saturday 3

This day commences with a thick fog middle and later part the same at seven A. M. got under way and stood at short at ten pm dropped anchor in five fathoms of water seven ships in sight

Sunday 4

This day commences with a thick fog middle and later part the same at eight A. M. got under way and made slow progress to N. ends this day sixteen ships in sight

Monday 5

This day commences with a thick fog middle and later part the same the crew employed in working ship at seven P. M. dropped anchor in five fathoms of water eight ships in sight

Tuesday 6

This day commences with a light S. W. wind middle and later part strong at ten A. M. got under way and commenced working to the windward spoke the Fifth Perry nine ships in sight at ten pm dropped anchor in five fathoms of water

Wednesday 7

This day commences with a light S. W. wind middle and later part the same at ten pm came to anchor in five fathoms of water
