Friday 9

This day commences with strong S. W. wind and thick weather middle and later part the same at ten A.M. got under way and stood off shore at eight p.m. came to anchor in five fathoms of water six ships in sight

Saturday 10

This day commences with a light S. W. wind and fog middle part the same later part strong N. E. wind gained the Glenoid at eight A.M. took our anchor and one p.m. dropped anchor

Sunday 11

This day commences with a strong N. E. wind middle and later part the same at seven A.M. got under way and commenced making to the N. twenty ships in sight James Allen captured a whale

Monday 12

This day commences with a strong N. E. and fine middle and later part the same Live Oak captured a whale twenty seven ships in sight

Tuesday 13

This day commences with a strong N. E. wind and fine weather middle part rainy later part the same spoke the Illinois twenty ships in sight

Wednesday 14

This day commences with a thick fog middle part the same later part clear spoke the B. C. at ten p.m. lowered ice boats for whales but no success sixteen ships in sight

Thursday 15

This day commences with a light N. wind and thick weather middle and later part clear saw several whales lowered the boats but no success much whaling captured several ships in sight

Friday 16

This day commences with a calm and thick weather middle and later part the same at five p.m. lowered the boats and the fog full runs

Saturday 17

This day commences with thick fog weather middle and later part the same crew employed in clearing the decks spoke the N. L.

Sunday 18

This day commences with a strong N. wind and fine weather and plenty of whales at ten p.m. lowered the Boats for whales the barbed boat struck and lost his line Bay Boat picked up a striker

Monday 19

This day commences with a strong N. wind and good weather plenty of whales plenty of ships five ships in the ice boats down most of the day

Tuesday 20

This day commences with a strong breeze from the S. W. and fine weather middle and later part the same at seven A.M. lowered the boats for whales but no success the Rescue abandoned spoke the J. A. with four whales

Wednesday 21

This day commences with a strong N. wind and a thick snow storm middle part the same later part clear lowered boats for whaling the barbed boat at night A.M. took our anchor at one p.m. came to anchor took a whale along side and commenced cutting finished cutting at seven and set watch twenty ships in sight

Thursday 22

This day commences with a strong N. wind and thick weather middle and later part the same crew employed in laying out Laggda ashore twelve ships in sight

Friday 23

This day commences with a calm middle part light breeze later part strong breeze at seven A.M. lowered two boats to help tow the Laggda of at ten p.m. lowered three boats for whaling the barbed boat struck and parted the line the Helena Thru abandoned in the ice

Saturday 24

This day commences with a strong N. wind and thick weather middle and later part the same crew employed in laying out at seven A.M. took our anchor and made all sail and put to southern with all the rest of the ships spoke the
