Thursday August 27<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light breeze and pleasant weather from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W. with all drawn sail set employed in fishing rigging 3 sail in sight middle part pleasant latter part employed in fishing rigging 3 sails in sight  
Lat by Obs 43.58 Long by Star 24.55 W

Friday August 28<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light breeze and pleasant weather from the S. ship heading to the W.S.W. employed in fishing rigging 2 sail in sight saw a school of black fish a young yacht the men were middle part saw 2 sails steering to the E.S.E. latter part employed in fishing rigging  
Lat by Obs 43.58 Long by Star 25.50 W

Saturday August 29<sup>th</sup>

Begins with moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W.S.W. at noon tack to the E.S.E. employed in fishing rigging at 6 P.M. the men were by up S.W. middle part latter part employed in various usefull jobs  
Lat by Obs 43.58 Long by Star 25.50 W

Sunday September 6<sup>th</sup> 1857

Begins with strong breeze and pleasant weather from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W. in afternoon in ship's duty sail in night middle part strong breeze and pleasant latter part part of the fore topmast sail fallen overboard  
Lat by Obs 44.52 Long by Obs 24.55 W

Monday September 7<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breeze and pleasant weather from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W. nothing in night middle part pleasant latter part of the watch employed in usefull jobs nothing in sight the Capt and Mr. Carpenter along slowly all of the rest having recovered  
Lat by Obs 44.55 Long by Obs 25.01 W

Tuesday September 8<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breeze and pleasant weather from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W. employed in usefull jobs 1 sail in sight steering to the W.S.W. middle part pleasant latter part employed in usefull jobs  
Lat by Obs 44.55 Long by Star 25.50 W

Wednesday September 9<sup>th</sup>

Begins with moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the E.S.E. ship heading to the S. the watch employed in usefull jobs all drawing sail but the wind veering to the E. middle part pleasant latter part rain to the E. ship heading to the S.E. 1 sail in sight  
Lat by Obs 45.00 Long by Obs 25.50 W
