Begins with strong breeze and squally weather from the S.E. ship heading to the E.S.E. under double reefed topsails jib and spanker and courses under full sail. Latter part more moderate made all drawing sail for back in sight.

Sunday September 27th

Begins with strong breeze and pleasant weather from the S.E. ship heading to the E.S.E. employed in ships duty for back in sight middle part the same latter part moderate breeze and W. wind course E.S.E.

Monday September 28th

Begins with moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the S.E. ship heading to the E.S.E. with all drawing sail set and in part the same latter part light wind and squally weather generally in the morning in sight.

Tuesday September 29th

Begins with light baffling wind and pleasant weather employed in ships duty at 4 P.M. a breeze sprang up from the S.E. ship heading to the E.S.E. with all drawing sail set and in part the same latter part employed in various usefull jobs. The Capt. sick and John St. Allen sails fast and well think that he will be out Monday.

Cruising Off St. Helena

Thursday October 6th 1887

Begins with strong breeze and fair weather from the S.E. at 4 P.M. got under weigh from Jamestown harbor St. Helena and stood out to sea heading to the E.S.E. under double reefed topsails and jib and courses stowed the anchor and cable until just before heading to the E. latter part a squall in clearing iron work. The Capt. on shore sick.

Sat by Obs 16.48.55 Long by Chron 18.13.10

Friday October 7th

Begins with strong breeze and fair weather from the S.E. ship heading to the E.S.E. employed in ships duty at 4 P.M. a breeze sprang up from the S.E. ship heading to the E.S.E. with all drawing sail set and in part the same latter part light wind and squally weather generally in the morning in sight bearing S.W. distant 10 leagues and 5 sails distant to the S.W.

Sat by Obs 18.58.55 Long by Chron 18.13.10

Saturday October 8th

Begins with moderate breeze and fair weather from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W. employed in various usefull jobs saw a shoal of rocks and 2 sail middle part squally weather latter more moderate employed in clearing iron work and other usefull jobs.
