

## Dunk Canton Packet's Log Book.

Tuesday March 9<sup>th</sup> 1858

Begins with fresh breezes and squally weather from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W. employed in ship duty blowing on fore & main sails to a close reefed main top sail and storm sails. Middle part more under latter part made all sail empty in filling salt water in the fore hold  
Latitude 33° 05' S Longitude 171° 45' E

Wednesday March 10<sup>th</sup>

Begins with moderate breezes and heavy weather from the S.E. ship heading to the E.S.E. under all sail, empty in ship duty middle part foggy latter part foggy all sail set nothing in sight  
Latitude 33° 05' S Longitude 172° 15' E

Thursday March 11<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light airs and foggy weather from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W. employed in reefing fore & main sails nothing in sight middle and latter part the same  
Latitude 33° 10' S Longitude 172° 00' E

Friday March 12<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light airs and foggy weather from the E. ship heading to the S.E. employed in reefing fore & main sails middle part the same latter part the wind from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W. nothing in sight

Sunday March 21<sup>st</sup> 1858

Begins with light breezes and pleasant weather from the E. ship heading to the S.E. under all sail at sundown shortened sail to double reefed top sails middle and latter part pleasant nothing in sight

Monday March 22<sup>nd</sup>

Begins with moderate breezes and pleasant weather from the S.E. ship heading to the S.W. under all sail at 6 P.M. tacked ship to the E.S.E. and shortened sail nothing in sight middle and latter part much the same  
Latitude 32° 45' S Longitude 173° 45' E

Tuesday March 23<sup>rd</sup>

Begins with moderate breezes and fair weather from the S.E. ship heading to the E. under all sail nothing in sight employed in ship duty middle and latter part the same  
Latitude 32° 05' S  
Longitude 174° 15' E

Wednesday March 24<sup>th</sup>

Begins with moderate breezes and pleasant weather from the S.E. ship heading to the E.S.E. under all sail employed in setting up the main rigging and tacking down middle part pleasant latter part tacked ship to the S.W. nothing in sight
