Sunday October 11<sup>th</sup>

Begins with moderate breeze and fair weather from the E. course S. W. sailing in irapall jibbs midland station and pass much the same but the 18. 19. 20.

Longitude 138.50. E.

Wednesday October 10<sup>th</sup>

Began with strong breezes and clear  
weather from the S. E. Course S. by E.  
mid the port the same latter part of  
8th. M. saw a sperm whale going to  
the wind were saw him but he  
did not leave a single drop of oil.

Wm Sharkey October 21<sup>st</sup>

Begin with strong breeze and clear  
weather from the E. shift head in  
the E. S. E. and fly in success the  
pursuit since a part the same fall  
part fresh breeze and rainy weather

Latitude 27.09. S.  
Longitude 157.55. E.



Saturday October 30<sup>th</sup> 1858

By day with a moderate gale from the S. E. B.  
ship being too under close reefed. Thence  
passing to the N. saw 4 or 5 hours with a heavy  
S. E. by East N. E. breeze at said even were close  
to the S. E. Middle part more sail or 1/2 more  
more sail latter part pleasant lying again  
in at fore. Shows at 6 A. M. sent in a sail  
it is east or about S. S. E. by E. for water

Latitude 31.42 S.  
Longitude 152.21 E.

Sunday October 31<sup>st</sup>

Winds with moderate breezes and clear  
weather from the S.E. being again on  
S. Large flows entering at dark but on  
shore a part of the water and left on  
shore Warren Wilson and John Smith  
deserted middle and latter part blowing  
a gale of wind from the S.E. shore being  
a close rapid heavy spray and storm  
on the east. Latitude 42.00 S.

Latitude 40° 15'  
Longitude 138° 20' E.

Monday November 1<sup>st</sup> 1858

Boys with a gale from the S. E. ship  
hoisted under a close reef. Main top sail  
and storm sails raising fair middle  
and latter part much the same.

*L. affinis* 32.0 S.  
*longitarsis* 18.9.0. E.
