Andas. May 31st 1889

Begins with moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the E. S. E. Lying off and on at Gates Bank after egg is laid. The latter part pleasant latitude 22. 34. S. Longitude 152. 00. E.

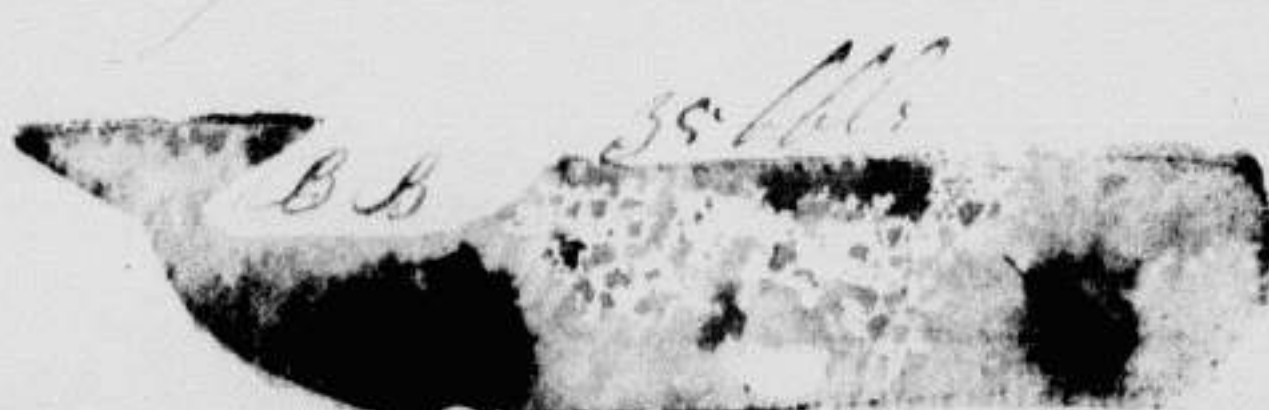
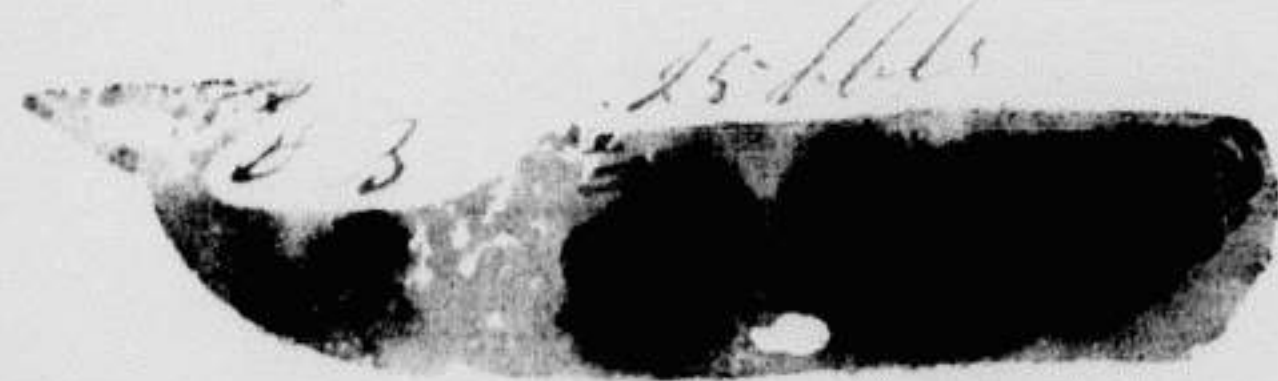
Monday May 9

Winds with moderate breezes in pleasant weather from the E. & E. ship hove in to the S. & could lay in ships cable at 5 P. M. were ship to the S. With a fair the same fall part at 8 A. M. saw a flock of the sea lion but at first that did not seem any more at all.

Latitude 44.50. N.
Longitude 155.50. E.

Thursday May 10th

Begins with moderate breeze and heavy weather from the E. ship heading to the N. E. at 1 P.M. Sacked to the deck & employed in repairing the row boat until four o'clock. Tethered boat at 4 P.M. saw a shoal of sperm whales heading to the E. at 5 P.M. pursued four of them and struck and killed 2 of them at noon took them to the ship and got ready for cutting. Latitude 18° 40' N. Longitude 105° 40' E.



Friday. May 27 1854

Begins with strong breeze and equally weather
during the E. S. ship's keel in to the N.
spoke the D. S. gunnery of 8 Bulwark
42 months out 3000 spars and other
latter part being breeze suitable to 1850. S.
for 1850. S. B.

Saturday May 18th

Begins with short breeze and pleasant
 weather from the basket finding the
 little saw & soil much the same
 part much the same. Latitude 20° N. E.
 Longitude 73° 55' N. E.

Sunday. May 29.

Began with moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the E. S. Bushnell heading to the S. East S. P. M. saw a school of sperm whales heading to the S. West 2 whales were within striking range and killed him at sundown took him to the ship and he was put through board cut him in half & finished latter part of evening boiling
