

Bark Canton Nacket's Log Book.
Monday November 25th 1866

Begins with strong breeze and squally weather from the N.W. ship heading to the W.S.W. couple in ships day middle and latter part much the same Latitude 38.10. S.
Longitude 159.30. E.

Tuesday November 26th

Begins with strong breeze and pleasant weather from the N.W. ship heading to the S.E. couple in ships day middle and latter part the same Latitude 38.40. S.
Longitude 159.50. E.

Wednesday November 27th

Begins with strong breeze and pleasant weather from the N.W. ship heading to the W.S.W. couple in ships day middle and latter part the same Latitude 38.10. S.
Longitude 159.55. E.

Thursday November 28th

Begins with moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the E. ship heading to the S.W. couple in ships day middle and latter part recovered our third of the whale from the Elizabeth. 14 bls or thereabouts Latitude 38.10. S.
Longitude 159.40. E.

Friday November 29th 1866

Begins with moderate breeze and rainy weather from the E. ship heading to the E.S.E. under short sail middle and latter part heading to the W.S.W. Latitude 38.10. S.
Longitude 159.10. E.

Saturday November 30th

Begins with moderate breeze and hazy weather couple in ships day middle and latter part rain S.E. ship heading to the N.W. Latitude 38.10. S.
Longitude 159.40. E.

Sunday December 1st 1866

Begins with strong breeze and hazy weather from the N.W. course S.E.S.W. couple in ships day at sundown rose to heading to the N.W. middle and latter part squally Latitude 36.30. S.
Longitude 158.50. E.

Monday December 2nd

Begins with moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the N.W. ship heading to the E.S.E. spoke the Island of St. Barts 12 hours out 750 fathoms middle and latter part the weather Latitude 36.10. S.
Longitude 159.10. E.
