Saturday January 12th 1861

Begins with pleasant weather employed in harbour duty Middle and latter part the same one watch on liberty

Sunday January 13th

Begins with pleasant weather employed in harbour duty Middle and latter part much the same one watch on liberty

Monday January 14th

Begins with pleasant weather employed in harbour duty Middle and latter part much the same one watch on liberty

Tuesday January 15th

Begins with pleasant weather employed in harbour duty Middle and latter part much the same

Wednesday January 16th

Begins with moderate breeze and pleasant weather employed in harbour duty Middle and latter part much the same received aboard a seamen named Theodore Perry

Thursday January 17th

Begins with pleasant weather employed in getting of ready Middle and latter part getting ready for sea

Friday January 18th 1861

Begins with pleasant weather employed in getting ready for sea Middle and latter part the same

Saturday January 19th

Begins with pleasant weather employed in harbour duty Middle part the same latter part hove up the anchor and saw in mid channel in turning out came in contact with the ship. Shifted away our line boats forward did not suffer damage

Sunday January 20th

Begins with moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the E.S.E. all ready for sea Middle and latter part much the same

Monday January 21st

Begins with moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the E.S.E. Middle and latter part much the same received the Reverend Mr. Carter takes passage with us to the U.S. States

Tuesday January 22nd

Begins with light breeze and pleasant weather from the E.S.E. all ready for sea Middle part the same ~~and~~ latter part at 8 A.M. got under way and went to sea wind E.S.E. ship heading to the S. at 9 A.M. discharged the pilot spoke the three Brothers Schooner 13 months and 200 sp. Latitude 34.50 N. Longitude 118.10 E.
