Thursday April 11th 1867

Begins with light breezes and hailing
with rainy weather employed in ships
day & sail in sight middle and latter
part the same Latitude 1.08.5.
Longitude 88.10.46

Friday April 12th

Begins with light airs and rain from
the N.E. course S.B.W. all sail set put
George & King in irons for being
delatory in going to the mast head to
look out for whales when ordered to
middle part the same latter part employed
in fitting rigging Latitude 00.38.5.
Longitude 88.13.46

Saturday April 13th

Begins with light trades and pleasant
from the N.E. course S.B.W. employed in
fitting rigging middle and latter part
the same Latitude 00.18.48.
Longitude 88.30.46

Sunday April 14th

Begins with light breezes and pleasant from
the N.E. course S.B.W. employed in ships day
& sail in sight middle and latter part
much the same Latitude 01.05.48.
Longitude 88.55.46

Monday April 15th 1867

Begins with light breezes and pleasant from
the N.E. course S.B.W. employed in fitting
rigging & sail in sight middle and latter part the
same S.B. King out Latitude 1.51.48.
Longitude 89.55.46

Tuesday April 16th

Begins with light breezes and pleasant from
the E.S.E. course S.B.W. employed in fitting
rigging middle and latter part much
the same Latitude 3.29.48
Longitude 89.00.46

Wednesday April 17th

Begins with moderate breezes and pleasant
from the N.E. course S.B.W. employed in
fitting rigging middle and latter part
the same Latitude 5.12.48.
Longitude 40.20.46

Thursday April 18th

Begins with strong trades and pleasant
from the N.E. course S.B.W. all sail set
employed in fitting rigging & sail in sight
middle and latter part much the
same Latitude 7.17.48.
Longitude 42.00.46
