

Remarks on Sunday December 2^d 1832

This Day commences with light winds from the Eastward bound all hands employed in various jobs of ship duty at 8 P.M. took ship to the North & East. Middle part fine pleasant weather at 8 & 11 took in the top & S. Latter part strong breezes and squally Latitude by Observation 35° 04' N. Dist. per Log 54 Miles.

Remarks on Monday Dec 3^d 1832

Begins with strong breezes from the South & East at 10 AM took one reef in the top Sails at 4 P.M. double reefed the top Sails and took in the M.S. Middle part & latter squally with rain at 8 A.M. saw a ship steering to the North & East. Ends squally with rain Lat by Obs 35° 23' N. No Obs. Dist per Log 113 miles 13th 14th

Remarks on Tuesday Dec 4th 1832.

Commences with strong winds from the South & East with heavy showers of rain at 3 PM the wind shifts to the West at 9 PM let the Rags out of the top Sails and let M-top & S. Middle part fresh breezes & cloudy Latter part strong breezes and cloudy with a heavy fog from the North & East. Lat by Obs 35° 58' N. Dist per Log 120 miles 13th 14th

Remarks on Wednesday Dec 5th 1832.

This day commences with strong winds from the N.E. with a heavy swell from about North. At 7 PM clear weather Middle part light breezes at 4 AM let out the reef and let fore & M top & S. Git and spanker all hands employed in ship duty. No Obs. Lat by Obs 35° 58' North. Dist per Log 99 Miles 15th 16th 17th by Obs 35° 59' N

Remarks on Thursday Dec 6th 1832.

Commences with light winds from the S.E. at 2 PM squally single reef the top S. At 6 PM spoke an English brig from London bound to Choules & E. Gullied myself in length of 87.30. Middle part light winds and clear weather at 10 AM put a sail to the South steering to the N.E. Latter part much like the former Lat Obs 35° 40' N. Dist 58.

Remarks on Board Friday December 7th 1832

Commences with light winds from the South & East all hands employed in ship duty at 10 PM squally Middle part somewhat squally Latter part fine weather. have not yet seen any Whales or other sporting fish Latitude by Obs 35° 22' North Dist 184 Miles. per Log 108

Remarks on Saturday December 8th 1832

Commences with light breezes from the South & East Ship company previously employed making gunpowder powder. Carpenter employed in his department. Middle & Latter much like the former Lat Obs 35° 21' N. Dist 84

Remarks on Sunday Dec 9th 1832

This 24 hours begins with pleasant weather all the ship company employed in filling Moulding gear. At 4 PM lowered the boats for exercise Middle part fine weather Latter part squally with heavy showers of rain in evening the Lowboard pump spear. The spear drove from the bow the Carpenter was employed the forenoon in cutting it out Lat by Obs 35° 25' N. Dist 84

Remarks on Monday Dec 10th 1832.

The day commences with strong breezes from the East and squally Middle part very squally with heavy showers of rain took in the M.S. Latter much like the former hands previously employed in ship duty Lat by Obs 35° 42' North Dist per Log 143 Miles. Variation 16° West

Remarks on Tuesday Dec 11th 1832.

Commences with strong winds from the South & East at 4 PM squally Middle part more pleasant. Latter part fresh breezes at 4 AM double reefed the top Sails. Ends squally Obs. Lat 35° 10' N. Dist per Log 103 Miles

Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec 12th 1832.

This day commences with strong winds from the Eastward Watch impd in ship duty at 5 PM let the M.S. at 7 PM squally took in the M.S. again Middle part squally with frequent & heavy showers of rain Latter part squally at 10 AM double reefed the top S. Obs. Lat 35° 41' N. Dist 84

Remarks on Thursday Dec 13th 1832

The day commences with strong winds from the East at 9 AM let Git & Spanker at midnight squally at 2 AM took in Git & Spanker Middle part squally at 6 AM let the M. Corrupt Latter part fresh winds Lat Obs. none by Log 29° 19' N. Dist per Log 94 miles

Remarks on Friday Dec 14th 1832.

Begins with fine breezes from the East hands employed in various jobs of ship duty Middle part moderate breezes Latter much like the former at 10 AM saw a Brig plowing to the West. ends fine weather Latitude Obs 27° 47' North Dist per Log 108 Miles. fine weather no fog
