

Remarks on board Thursday Jan 17th 1833

Commenced with light breezes from the ESE to NE & North and some light rain some hands employed in the fore hold. This continued throughout with light variable winds and some rain occasionally. This fore noon the watch employed in picking over our potatoes and other jobs of ship study. Lat by Obs 27° 36' S. Dist 18 Miles. Ther 28° 30' Lat 1° 30'

Remarks on Friday Jan 18th 1833

Commenced light breezes from the East. all hands employed in ship study. At 7 PM wind breezing up to fore top M.S.S. Middle part fine breezes & pleasant weather. At 6 AM top 9 S.S. and L.S. latter part strong winds from the NNE. fore a Bird turning to the East. Lat by Obs 29° 05' South Dist per Log 64 Miles. Ther 30°. Hum 75° N.W.

Remarks on board Saturday Jan 19th 1833

This 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the N.E. took in Royal top 9 S.S. lower 8 S. At 1 PM took in 2nd M.S. At 7 PM wind increasing took in the top 9 S.S. At 8 took 2 reef in the fore & M.S. top 9 S. At 9 PM took in M.S. and double reefed the M top 8. Middle part strong winds and rain. At 6 AM took one reef out of the M top 8 and 1st M.S. Latter strong winds from the S.E. by E. and a high sea. Lat by Obs 31° 10' South Dist per Log 176 Miles. Ther 74°. Hum 75° N.W.

Remarks on board on Sunday Jan 20th 1833

Commenced with strong winds from the N.E. with a very bad pull running from the N.E. & South. and foggy. with light rain. At 10 PM let one reef out of the fore and M top 8. Middle part fresh winds and clearing. At 7 AM 1st whole top 1st and M top 9 S. Latter part strong breezes and flying clouds. Saw a large white Albatross. Lat by Obs 32° 29' South Dist per Log 142 Miles. Ther 75°. Hum 75° N.W. Long 85° 30'

Remarks on board on Monday Jan 21st 1833

Commenced with strong breezes from the East with light showers of rain. At 3 PM 1st fore & M top 9 S. Middle part fine breezes and clear weather. At 8 PM commenced breaking out the main hold for water. It being pleasant I concluded it best to get out water enough to lay up around Cape Horn. being well to the South. cannot expect any more rain. At 10 AM Latter part fine clear weather winds from the N.E. & E. Lat by Obs 33° 48' South Dist per Log 100 Miles. Ther 75°. Hum 75° N.W. Long 84° 10'

Remarks on Board Tuesday Jan 22nd 1833

Begins with light winds from the N.E. & all hands employed in getting water from the hole at 3 PM. wind came to the N.E. at 4. Wind still inclining to the N.E. braced up the yards at 8 PM. Wind blowing fresh took in fore & M top 9 S. At 10 PM wind increasing took in M top 9 S and took one reef in the top 8. Middle part strong winds & gradually double reefed the top 8. Took in 1st & 2nd M.S. Latter part strong winds from the S.W. and clear weather fore a number of black Hagglets. Last night I passed a very bad night with the rheumatism in my legs to figure I could not get any rest but to day am better. Lat by Obs 34° 28' South Dist per Log 118 Miles. Ther 74°. N. Variation Long 85° 10' W.

Remarks on Board Wednesday Jan 23rd 1833

This 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the South. all hands employed in various jobs of ship study. At 2 PM fore a Barque sailing to the North & East. At 7 PM gale moderate with a heavy pull from the South. At 9 PM took in ship to the South wind veering to the N.E. Middle part squally with light showers of rain. At 2 AM took in M.S. At dawn wind veering to the South near ship to South light. Latter part strong gales & squally. At noon close under fore & M top 1st. Lat by Obs 34° 56' S. Dist per Log 124 Miles. Ther 72°. N. Variation Long 84° 10' W.

Remarks on Board Thursday Jan 24th 1833

Commenced with strong breezes from the South & East. all hands employed in various jobs of ship study. At 6 PM wind veered to the East a very heavy pull from the S.E. Middle part moderate. At dawn 1st the M top 8 S. Latter part 1st a large whale towards the boat, but without success. The foremast of a fisherman's life twice towing to day & night. Saw a great number of Whales but too rough to do anything with the boats. Lat by Obs 35° 39' S. Dist per Log 85 Miles. Ther 72°. N. Variation Long 84° 10' W.

Remarks on Board Friday Jan 25th 1833

Commenced with fresh breezes from the N.E. & E. Ship under all sail. Middle part some squally took in the top 9 S. & top M.S. At 5 clear moderate sail again. Ends with fine weather. Lat by Obs 37° 11' S. Dist 160 Miles. Ther 70°. Inclining for the land of the ship. This day took a lunar Obs. by measuring the Dist. by Obs. 37° 11' S. Dist 160 Miles. Ther 70°. Inclining for the land of the ship.
