Commences with thick wet weather and light winds from the North. and a heavy swell from S.W. at 7 P.M. wind falling off and increasing again at 11 P.M. tacked to North & toward the west out of the top sails at 1 M to 2 P.M. Middle Port fine weather with some flying clouds Latten Port cloudy & thick Ketch employed in filling boats & coals. Lat by Obs 47. 57. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. W.

Thursday March 14th 1833. Commences with light breezes from the North. Ketch employed in ship duty. at 6 P.M. wind coming North by took in fore top M.S. Middle Port light winds & foggy. at 3 A.M. took a light breeze from N.W. Latten Port fine pleasant weather Ketch vigorously employed Lat by Obs 46. 6. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Friday March 15th 1833. Commences with fine breezes from S.W. Ketch employed in filling boats. at 7 P.M. fore top M.S. Middle Port fine clear weather at 11 A.M. got a distance of the O.C. found the long to be 142. 20. W. Latten Port fine winds & weather Carpenter & Blacksmith employed in building foremast fine winds from the N.W. & S.W. Lat by Obs 45. 29. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. Saturday March 16th 1833. Commences with pleasant weather & fine winds from the S.W. steering N.W. Ketch employed in filling the boats & Ketchmen. Middle Port pleasant weather winds variable from N.W. to S.W. Latten fine weather & moderate breezes Carpenter & Blacksmith busy employed in repairing what has been replaced of the Cape in foremast & sails. at 10 A.M. got a distance of the O.C. found the long to be 142. 15. Sunday March 17th 1833. Begins with light winds from N.W. Ketch employed in necessary jobs of ship duty. Middle Port fine weather at 2 P.M. wind could double upon the top. Latten Port fine weather. Lat by Obs 45. 7. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. W.

Monday March 18th 1833. Commences with fine winds from the S.W. and fine weather at 2 P.M. took the top. at 6 P.M. clear out near 8 M to 9.5. at 5 P.M. proceeding rapidly up with the land took in fore top. at 6.5 M.S. and flew N.W. Middle Port breezes and fine clear weather Latten Port fine clear weather Ketch vigorously employed in sailing. Lat by Obs 45. 26. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. W.

Tuesday March 19th 1833. Commences with moderate breezes and fine weather with a heavy swell from the S.W. Middle Port fine pleasant weather a great many black fish Latten Port fine breezes from the N.W. saw some whales but no sperm whale saw great quantities of shell fish & sea urchins. Lat by Obs 45. 37. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. W.

Wednesday March 20th 1833. Commences with moderate winds from S.W. all hands employed in various jobs of ship duty. Middle Port fine weather breeze a fine Latten Port much like the former fine plenty of Black Whales & Bristles of all kinds this day the water has had a dirty greenish colour. Lat by Obs 46. 32. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. W.

Thursday March 21st 1833. Commences with moderate winds from S.W. fine the corner of the land in our view at 8 P.M. wind veered to N.W. took in fore top. Middle Port light breezes from N.W. fine plenty of Black fish & some black whales at 5 A.M. made the land between Falcater & Hornet through the land is high and has a brownish appearance and hills is seen at look as if man or beast were present on it although we saw several marks of huts or small volcanoes at 7 A.M. tacked & flood of Latten Port breezes and fine clear weather. Friday March 22nd 1833. Commences with moderate breezes from the North. Ketch employed in various jobs of ship duty. at morning thick and foggy Middle Port thick black at 10 A.M. wind lighted suddenly to S.W. Latten Port thick & cloudy saw a great number of black fish whales & Bristles of different kinds. Lat by Obs 46. 54. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. W.

Saturday March 23rd 1833. Begins with light winds from the S.W. Middle Port moderate breezes and thick weather. at 6 A.M. from the land bearing above the deck and looking very low. at 8 A.M. saw the shore very plain high & steep to some some were Latten Port moderate saw the breaker on Falcater & Hornet. Lat by Obs 46. 54. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. W.

Sunday March 24th 1833. Commences with moderate breezes from the S.W. and fine weather at 2 P.M. saw a Brig showed our colour she in return showed the Union flag. at 2 P.M. saw another brig. at 7 P.M. being off Valparaiso point I promptly concluded to lay by and send in a boat to see if I could not get a crew hauled by the wind & foremast sail at 8 P.M. wind breezing up fresh I gave up the idea of going in kept the ship off down the coast of Madejail Middle Port fresh breezes and flying clouds Latten much like the former nothing seen. Monday March 25th 1833. Begins with fresh breezes from S.W. ship under all sail Middle Port strong breezes from S.W. Latten much like the former saw nothing worthy of note. Lat by Obs 46. 22. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. W.

Tuesday March 26th 1833. Ship under all necessary sail hands busily employed in various jobs of ship duty Carpenter & Blacksmith Middle Port strong winds and thick cloudy weather Latten Port more moderate but cloudy. Lat by Obs 46. 26. S. Long 144. 25. W. Dist 45. M. 55. Lat 2. 1/2. Long 144. 25. W.
