

54. Remarks on Board October 22^d 1833.

Commenced with moderate breezes from the S by E. and fine clear weather employed in mending Boats which sound considerably injured at the Ground some hands employed in fanning Wood Middle Port strong winds and a fine weather Latter Part moderate breezes and fine clear weather Painting Boats Laid by Ob. 56. 10. 10. Sun had

Wednesday October 23^d 1833. Begins with moderate winds from the S by E and fine clear weather at 6 P.M. took in M top 9^o

Middle Port fresh breezes from the S by E. and fine pleasant weather Latter Part much as the former had Ob. 57. 28. 10. Sun had

Thursday October 24th 1833. Commences with strong winds from the S at 7 P.M. took in M top 9^o and put single reef in the top 8^o

Middle Port strong breezes but clear ship under single reef at 8 P.M. 8^o 8^o Spruce standing to N.E. on the wind Latter Part moderate made sail nothing to be seen Laid by Ob. 58. 25. 8. South

Friday October 25th 1833. Begins with fresh winds from the S. Ship under all sail to N.E. hands variously employed in ship duty Middle Port fine breezes and clear under the M top 9^o 8^o

and a new one Latter much like the former Laid by Ob. 59. 28. 8.

Saturday October 26th 1833. Commences with moderate breezes from the S by E. and fine weather Middle Port light winds and small showers of rain put out the Lower Port Latter like the former hands variously employed in ship duty Laid by Ob. 60. 32. South

Sunday October 27th 1833. Commences with light air of wind from the N by N. and fine pleasant weather employed as usual on the Sabbath reading and meditating on the goodness of God to us poor miserable sinners the S by E. Middle Port moderate winds and pleasant weather Latter much like the former Laid by Ob. 61. 34. 8.

Monday October 28th 1833. Begins with fresh breezes from the S by E ship heading on the N by E tack at 6 P.M. touched ship to South Middle Port fine weather touched to N by E Latter Part fresh breezes and fine pleasant weather but nothing to be seen of the whale head Laid Ob. 62. 13. 8.

Tuesday October 29th 1833. Commences with moderate breezes and fine weather at 2 P.M. saw a fine bank at 6 P.M. saw Spinn whales toward the Boats but did not get on Middle Port fine winds and weather Latter Part much like the former saw a large Spinn whale but lost the run of her own fine weather Laid Ob. 63. 29. 8.

Wednesday October 30th 1833. Begins with fine breezes from the S by E and pleasant weather Middle Port moderate at 6 A.M. touched to the South Latter much like the former Laid by Ob. 64. 28. 8. Sun had

Thursday October 31st 1833. Commences with moderate breezes and fine clear weather at 10 A.M. raised Spinn Whales lowered the Boats the Starboard Boat succeeded in taking one of them a 20 lbs. showed signs of 12 took her to the Ship and fine Laid by Ob. 65. 28. 8. Long 131. 20. 0.

Friday November 1st 1833. Commences with moderate breezes from the S by E and fine weather at 6 P.M. took one reef in the top 8^o Ship under 8 by E. Middle Port fine pleasant weather at 1 A.M. touched to North

at 10 P.M. touched to North Middle Port much like the former Laid by Ob. 66. 26. 8. Long 131. 30. 40.

Saturday November 2nd 1833. Begins with moderate breezes and fine weather winds from S by E to S by E Middle Port light winds and fine clear weather at 10 A.M. raised Spinn Whales lowered the Boats the Starboard Boat succeeded in taking one of them a 20 lbs. showed signs of 12 took her to the Ship and fine Laid by Ob. 67. 28. 8. Long 131. 20. 0.

Sunday November 3rd 1833. Commences with moderate breezes from the S by E employed in pulling in the shade finished at 6 P.M. Middle Port clear & pleasant ship under short sail at 6 A.M. saw Spinn Whales lowered succeeded in taking two of them one to the Starboard 20 lbs. 1 to the North Boat of 35 lbs. did not get fast at 11 A.M. took them to the Ship the fish of these Whales makes very mean countenance looks glass open our long pieces of board (under one board managed in shalving under fine clear weather Laid by Ob. 68. 28. 8. South

Remarks on Board ^{Thurs} Saturday October 31st 1833-53

Commences with fresh winds from the S by E. and fine clear weather at 6 P.M. took in the top 9^o at 11 P.M. equally took one in the top 8^o Middle Port fresh breezes and fine clear weather Latter Part much like the former saw Whales breaching to South but did not get fast no more Ende this day newly discovered Laid Ob. 69. 28. 8. Sun had

Friday November 4th 1833. Commences with moderate breezes and fine weather at 1 P.M. signoured Spinn Whales close to the Ship lowered the Boats and chased them but could not get fast at 3 P.M. the Boats returned to the Ship with the usual success Middle Port light winds and pleasant weather Latter Part like the former Laid by Ob. 70. 28. 8. Sun had

Saturday November 5th 1833. Commences with light winds and pleasant weather at 10 A.M. touched ship to the North Middle Port equally ship heading S by N Latter Part fine breezes Laid Ob. 71. 18. 8. South

Sunday November 6th 1833. Begins with moderate winds from the S by E and fine pleasant weather Ship on the North tack employed as usual on the Sabbath Day Middle Port light winds and pleasant weather at 1 P.M. touched ship to S by E Latter Part light winds and fine weather Laid Ob. 72. 28. 8.

Monday November 7th 1833. This Day Commences with fine breezes from the S by E ship on the South tack under whole top 8^o and M top 9^o Middle Port moderate and pleasant at 1 A.M. touched ship to North Latter Part much like the former Laid by Ob. 73. 28. 8. Long 131. 30. 40.

Tuesday November 8th 1833. Commences with moderate breezes from the S by E and fine weather at 6 P.M. took one reef in the top 8^o Ship under 8 by E. Middle Port fine pleasant weather at 1 A.M. touched to North

at 10 P.M. touched to North Middle Port much like the former Laid by Ob. 74. 26. 8. Long 131. 30. 40.

Wednesday November 9th 1833. Begins with moderate breezes and fine weather winds from S by E to S by E Middle Port light winds and fine clear weather at 10 A.M. raised Spinn Whales lowered the Boats the Starboard Boat succeeded in taking one of them a 20 lbs. showed signs of 12 took her to the Ship and fine Laid by Ob. 75. 28. 8. Long 131. 20. 0.

Thursday November 10th 1833. Commences with moderate breezes from the S by E employed in pulling in the shade finished at 6 P.M. Middle Port clear & pleasant ship under short sail at 6 A.M. saw Spinn Whales lowered succeeded in taking two of them one to the Starboard 20 lbs. 1 to the North Boat of 35 lbs. did not get fast at 11 A.M. took them to the Ship the fish of these Whales makes very mean countenance looks glass open our long pieces of board (under one board managed in shalving under fine clear weather Laid by Ob. 76. 28. 8. South
