

Remarks on Board Sunday March 7th 1834

Commenced with light breezes from the land and fine weather. One half of the crew on shore on liberty. Patterson received his discharge at the Seamen's Chapel but few hands. under fine

Remarks on Board Monday 8th March 1834

Began with moderate winds off the land and fine weather. Employed in painting the ship under paint and seal.

Remarks on Tuesday March 11th 1834

Commenced with light breezes from the land with fine weather. Middle Port came cloudy weather. Light showers for most of day.

Remarks on Wednesday March 12th 1834

Began with fresh breezes off the land employed in painting. Latter strong squalls off the land and some rain towards the day.

Remarks on Thursday 13th March 1834

Commenced with strong breezes and squalls weather with some rain wind from the land. People employed in scattering seeds the day.

Remarks on Board Friday March 14th 1834

Began with fresh breezes from the land with showers of rain. Employed in getting off water and throwing it aboard to use this day.

Remarks on Board Saturday 15th March

Commenced with thick squally weather. Middle Port heavy squalls of wind from the land. Latter like the former. Some rain the day.

Remarks on Sunday March 16th 1834

Commenced with moderate breezes from the land and fine weather. One half of the crew on liberty. This day Patterson received his discharge in the Seamen's Chapel and was much gratified to find so great a number in attendance. Mr. Hall gave a very good sermon. This afternoon I took tea in company with Capt. Gimes and Mr. Perkins of Boston whose husband was on the Coast of California on a trading voyage.

Remarks on Monday March 17th 1834

Began continues on with moderate breezes from the NW and heavy squalls of rain. was thick & squally.

Remarks on Board Tuesday March 18th 1834

Commenced with moderate breezes from the SW and fine weather. This day Mr. Bartolo carpenter of the Brig, La Ganga of Progreso built me a boat put his hands on shore to assist him. Latter on liberty. Latter Port moderate weather and cloudy.

Remarks on Board Wednesday March 19th 1834

Commenced with moderate breezes from the land and fine weather. People employed in painting the ship. Latter two hands painting boats on the boat. Latter Port light moderate winds from the SE for most of day.

Remarks on Board Thursday March 20th 1834

Began. Continues on with fine weather and light winds.

Remarks on Board Friday March 21st 1834

Commenced with light winds from the SE and fine weather. Mr. Hall the ship's surgeon of Warren's schooner in the rear from a wreck with 35 bbls of oil 16 months old. Latter Port fine clear weather for most of the day.

Remarks on Board Saturday March 22nd 1834

Commenced with moderate winds from the land put our boat to land. The gunnery Mr. Hall and latter much like the former. Latter on liberty.

Remarks on Board Sunday March 23rd 1834

Commenced with light breezes from the land and fine weather. One half of the crew on liberty. Middle and latter on the former. Patterson's Chapel in the Seamen's Chapel.

Remarks on Board Monday March 24th 1834

Began with light winds from the SE. People employed in various jobs of their duty. Took on board 20 bbls of yams under fine weather.

Remarks on Board Tuesday March 25th 1834

Began with strong breezes from the SE and squally with showers of rain. People employed in various jobs of their duty. This even the day.

Remarks on Board Wednesday March 26th 1834

Commenced with squally rainy weather winds from the SE to NW. Middle Port strong breezes at 4 PM to the SE. anchor continues squally with strong breezes and heavy showers of rain. wind NW and fresh.
