

Remarks on Friday April 11th 1834

Commenced with fine breezes from the S.W. and pleasant fine weather all day to the 10th 11 P.M. took in M.S. and top S. Middle Port fine weather and pleasant breezes at 7 A.M. put down the fore and aft. Royal yards and Masts. Latter Part fine weather wind increasing took in M.Camp Lat. 23° 30' N. Lon. 56°

Remarks on Board Saturday April 12th 1834

Commenced with fresh breezes from the S.W. ship on the 10th took in M.S. and double reefed the top S. Middle Port heavy breezes at 6 A.M. made all sail on the fore and aft ship heading N.E. by N. Latter moderate breezes and fine moon saw nothing of the whale kind Lat by Mad. 25° 16' N. Lon. 56°

Remarks on Sunday April 13th 1834

Commenced with moderate breezes from the S.W. to E.N. and fine weather. Unsettled the M.S. and sent the old one at 6 P.M. took in M.S. and double reefed the top S. took in G. and Spanish Middle Port light winds and pleasant Lat. 26° 05' N. Lon. 57°

Remarks on Board Monday 14th April 1834

Commenced with moderate winds from the S.W. and fine weather. Employed in mending and mending on the work of God as usual on the Sabbath day at 6 P.M. took in M.S. and double reefed the top S. wind from the S.W. and fine Middle Port light breezes and clear weather at 6 A.M. cloudy moon set and left off N.E. by N. Latter Part cloudy with the rain wind from the S.W. Lat by Mad. 26° 27' 37" N. Lon. 57°

Remarks on Board Tuesday April 15th 1834

Commenced with moderate breezes from E.N. with cloudy weather at 3 P.M. came on rain and squally double reefed the top Sails and by the wind at 4 P.M. rain moderating wind rising away to our bay and of the top S. Wind coming to S.W. Middle Port light winds and cloudy at 8 A.M. raised Spinn Whales from the water and kept towards the boats and proceeded in capturing four 20th Lat. Latter Part light breezes and fine weather. 16 boats got 2 Whales on the 20th and 10th boats got 1 each under fine weather Boats 23 in pursuit of Whales a good day's work by the blessing of God whom I sincerely thank

Remarks on Board Wednesday April 16th 1834

Commenced with light breezes from the S.W. at 3 P.M. took the top Whales the Ship hooked on and took in two of them Middle Port fine weather with smooth sea at 5 A.M. called all hands hooked on and in one more whale at 7 A.M. raised Whales again towards the boats and the others being wild proceeded in taking only one of them at 11 A.M. took her to the Ship and with light breezes and fine Lat. 27° 37' N. Lon. 57°

Remarks on Board Thursday April 17th 1834

Commenced with light breezes from the S.W. and fine weather at 3 P.M. hooked on and took in the two remaining Whales at 5 P.M. finished and on the 18th took in the 20th heading E.N. all hands busy employed in getting ready for boiling Middle Port moderate and fine cloudy weather Part fine employed in boiling Lat. 27° 16' North Lon. 56° Long 56° W. 18

Remarks on Board Friday April 18th 1834

Commenced with fresh breezes from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather People employed in boiling getting up coffee etc. Ship on the 18th heading E.N. Middle Port light breezes and thick cloudy weather saw many birds of different kinds Latter Part fine breeze and thick cloudy sky weather with squalls of rain Lat. 27° 57' North

Observations on Board Saturday April 19th 1834

Commenced with light winds and thick weather employed in boiling and other jobs of Ship duty at 9 P.M. finished boiling and cleared kitchen Middle Port fresh breezes and thick cloudy weather at 4 A.M. took in the fore and aft Spanish and close reefed the fore top S. Latter Part fresh breeze and squally with light showers of rain wind from the S.W. saw many Birds of various kinds but no whales Lat. 28° 28' N. Lon. 55° 00' W. 19

Observations on Sunday April 20th 1834

Commenced with strong gales from the S.W. and thick cloudy rainy weather with a high sea and at 7 P.M. some ships to the S.W. Middle Port strong gales and squally at 6 A.M. took in the fore and aft top Sails Latter Part fresh gales with squalls of rain wind from the S.W. ship on the 18th heading N.E. making 16th Camp. Squally with showers of rain Lat. 27° 42' N. Lon. 56° 00' W. 20
Employed in mending the hoys, jibs, and mending on the work of God to up poor miserable worms of the dust. Praise many to say with the Apostle at God what is man that we forget him or the Lord of man that those who forget him
