

Remarks on Board Monday August 11th 1834

Commenced with moderate winds from the W and some cloudy ship under whole top 8th and W top 9th blowing N.N.W. At 6 P.M. took in W top 9th Gib and sprang on a double reef the top 1st and 2nd P.M. took in the fore and top 1st and brought by the wire to N.W. Middle Port moderate winds and fine weather At 6 P.M. took in W top 8th double reefed fore with heavy showers of rain but till wind from the N.W. At 11 A.M. took in heavy and squally look in the top sails and fore 8th and with squally and heavy rain wind veered to the N.W. Lat 28° 52' N. Therm 80° in the Cabin

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 12th 1834

Commenced with light winds and squally weather At 3 P.M. cleared up for the fore and W top 8th double reefed moderate breeze with fine light showers of rain wind from the N.W. At 6 P.M. took in the fore top 8th ship head to North on N.W. look Middle Port light winds and fine weather At 6 P.M. made all sail kept off 180° fine breeze from the N.W. Latter Port steady breeze with fine clear weather People variously employed in ship duty Lat by Ob. 28° 54' N. Therm

Observations on Board Wednesday August 13th

Commenced with light winds from the N.W. ship under all sail to N.W. At 2 P.M. some flying clouds At 3 P.M. got a glimpse of the Sun & Moon the Longitude I found to be 172° 17' E. At 6 P.M. double reefed the top 1st and took in the fore top 8th hoisted up the fore 1st for the night At 10 P.M. light squalls of rain Middle Port moderate breeze with a long swell the N.W. At 5 A.M. squally with showers of rain At 7 A.M. cleared out and set top 9th flying Gib etc. Latter Port light air inclining to calm People variously employed in ship duty Lat by Ob. 28° 53' N. Therm 83°

Remarks on Board Thursday August 14th 1834

Commenced with light calm weather with a very hot sun smooth sea but no Whales to be seen what a voyage of puffing every one coming to looking for the throat of a Whale many long fairs and horns but At 6 P.M. took in top 9th and W 1st and 2nd by squalls of rain but no wind hoisted up the fore 1st Middle Port light air inclining to calm At 6 A.M. wind veered to the S.W. with a light air - top 9th flying Gib and W 1st Latter Port a light air from the S.W. with clear weather and a very hot sun Lat by Ob. 28° 52' N. Therm 86° in the Cabin Longitude 172° 30' E.

Remarks on Board Friday August 15th 1834

Commenced with a light air from the S.W. and fine clear weather and a very hot sun, smooth sea, but no Whales. At 6 P.M. calm took in top 9th and cleared down the top 8th and hoisted out the reef tacks light breeze from the S.W. hoisted up the top 8th and top 9th 9th 10th - Latter Port light winds and light rain Lat by Ob. 28° 46' N. Therm 85° in the Cabin Longitude 173° 00' E.

Remarks on Board Saturday August 16th 1834

Commenced with light winds from the S.W. with some light squalls of rain People variously employed in ship duty, fine smooth sea At 6 P.M. took in top 9th flying Gib and single reefed the top 8th and hoisted up the top 8th At 6 A.M. out ruffs and top 9th wind from the S.W. with fine clear weather At 7 A.M. kept off N.W. 55° under the M.S. for repairs all hands employed on the M.S. Latter Port moderate breeze and fine weather ship under all sail to the best advantage Lat by Ob. 28° 07' N. Therm 87°

Remarks on Board Sunday August 17th 1834

Light winds from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather At 2 P.M. sent a ship to the N.W. standing to the N.W. At 6 P.M. took in the top 9th At 8 P.M. the fore top 8th came up with up top 9th spoke the ship Victory of N. Bedford Capt. Mahan. Middle Port light air inclining to calm At 6 A.M. made sail ship Victory in company Latter Port light air and pleasant. Employed on repairs on the Sabbath Lat by Ob. 28° 45' N. Therm 86° in the Cabin

Remarks on Board Monday August 18th 1834

Begins with a light breeze from the S.W. At 6 P.M. Capt. Mahan came on board to show the after noon ship heading to N.W. with a light air At 6 P.M. took in the top 9th flying Gib etc. At 9 P.M. Capt. Mahan returned to his ship. Middle Port calm with light clouds At 6 A.M. made sail to the North light winds and squally winds variable with showers of rain under the fore 8th for repairs came on rainy but another fine the 2nd Officer on board the Victory to mending knifs At 11 returned Latter Port moderate winds and clearing the Victory still in company to the S.W. Lat by Ob. 28° 46' N. Therm in the Cabin 86°

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 19th 1834

Light winds from the S.W. and some cloudy ship on the S.W. under all sail looking for Whales. At 6 P.M. shortened sail double reefed the fore 1st Middle Port onamate Latter Port on the fore - Lat by Ob. 28° 56' N. Therm 86° Longitude 176° 00' E.
