

Remarks on Board Wednesday Aug. 20th 1834

Began with moderate wind from the S.W. and some fog. Ship under all sail to the N.E. At 12 P.M. saw whale spout to windward at 3 found them to be from lower the Boat, found them very wild but pursued in getting one to the vessel. At 1 P.M. got him to the Ship. Doubled reefed the top 5th by the whale. At 10 P.M. pulled in top 5th. Middle Port light wind from the S.W. At 4 A.M. commenced cutting in the whale. At 8 P.M. got all in and put down the pump. At 10 A.M. began boiling the head. Latter Port fresh wind from the S.W. with fine wind employed in boiling. Before the water has changed from an ocean blue to a greenish colour much like porridge with a ripple of a current. Lat. 29.49 N. Therm 86 in. below.

Remarks on Board Thursday Aug. 21st 1834

Commenced with light wind from the S.W. inclining to the right. Employed in boiling ship under double reefed top 5th on wind to N.E. At 4 P.M. observed the water much rippled quite a light green. At 6 P.M. the appearance of fundings and as there is a bay upon horizon. At 8 P.M. inclined to think it correct. At 5 P.M. more ship to S.W. wind veering to S. Middle Port more wind with a rough sea on 11 A.M. finished boiling and cleared up. Latter Port fresh breeze from S.W. with a bay. On the water has lost the greenish appearance that it had yesterday and become an ocean blue. Lat. 29.51 N. Therm 86.

Remarks on Board Friday Aug. 22nd 1834

Commenced with fresh breeze and a high sea and with heavy weather wind from the S.W. and weather for whaling commencing. At 6 P.M. took in the fore top 5th & 8th. Fresh breeze from the S.W. At 10 P.M. pulled in top 5th & 8th. Middle Port fresh breeze from the S.W. At 11 P.M. to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 1 P.M. up to the fore top 5th to repair with heavy weather with fresh wind from the S.W. Latter Port fresh wind with cloudy weather. People employed in repairing top 5th and further other jobs of the ship. At 10 P.M. looking out for whales etc. For a few days past I have thought much more of my dear friends and children than usual. Grieved for the dear ones and for the dear ones and for the dear ones. At 1 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 3 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 5 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 7 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 9 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 11 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. Lat. 29.52 N. Therm 85.

Remarks on Board Sunday Aug. 24th 1834

Began with fresh breeze from the S.W. and fine weather. Ship under all sail to the N.E. At 11 P.M. to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 1 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 3 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 5 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 7 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 9 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. At 11 P.M. up to the fore top 5th and 8th. Lat. 29.54 N. Therm 86. Long 170. 50 W.
