

Remarks on Board Monday Sept 1st 1834

Commenced with steady breeze from the E. and fine pleasant weather ship under single reefed top 10 to the S.S. 5 to 6 P.M. doubled under the M. top 8 and took in the Fore & M. tops to the M. Mast. Middle Port heavy rain and fine weather 11 1/2 A.M. to 1 P.M. and top 10 to 6 let one reef out of 7 1/2 M. top 5 1/2 and Spunher 11 1/2 and ship to S.S. 8 to 10. 10 to 12 M. top 5 for repairs. Latter Part heavy rain and fine weather. People employed in repairing M. top tail, etc. Latitude 30. 30 N. Long 176. 30 W. Time 85.

Remarks on Board Tuesday September 2nd 1834

Commenced with steady winds from the E. and fine pleasant weather ship on Ch. tack to the S.S. People employed on the M. top 10. 11 A.M. took the M. top 8. 11 1/2 P.M. took in the M. top 5 and top reefed. The Fore & M. took in G. and Spunher. Ship heading S.S. Middle Port heavy rain and fine weather. 11 1/2 A.M. to 1 P.M. the M. top 8 G. and Spunher to two reefs out of the Fore & M. top 8. Latter Part fresh breeze with light squalls wind inclining to the S.S. ship heading light over fine. Lat. 30. 30 N. Time 85.

Remarks on Board Wednesday September 3rd 1834

Commenced with fresh breeze from E. and fine clear weather ship under single reefed top 10 G. and Spunher heading S.S. 10 P.M. saw whales proceed to be spun toward the boats but could not get on to them 11 1/2 Boats returned took in the Fore and M. top tails G. and Spunher and double reefed the M. top 10 P.M. wind fresh to the S.S. fresh breeze and clear Middle Port fresh and clear wind to E. 11 1/2 A.M. to the Fore and M. top 8 saw Spunher whales toward the Boats proceeded in getting on to the S.S. Boat 11 1/2 A.M. took her to the ship 11 1/2 commenced cutting very rough sea on very low cutting Latter Part fresh wind and squalls to North get all in making up 49 Whales Lat. 30. 30 N. Time 86 in the Cabin

Remarks on Board Thursday Sept. 4th 1834

Began with steady winds from the East and fine clear weather but a rough sea employed in cutting up the head 11 1/2 P.M. began to hoist and took in G. and Spunher 8 1/2 M. top 8. Middle Port moderate with squalls from the S.S. 11 1/2 A.M. to 1 P.M. took in one reef out of the top 10. Latter Part moderate breeze and fine weather employed in hoisting and other necessary jobs Lat. 30. 26 N. Time 87. In the fore

Remarks on Board Friday Sept 5th 1834

Commenced with moderate breeze from the East and fine pleasant weather 11 1/2 P.M. finished hoisting and put up 39 lbs. ship on the S.S. took the M. top 8 under single reefed top 10 11 1/2 P.M. took in the Fore and M. top 8. Middle Port light and variable with fine weather 11 1/2 A.M. to 1 P.M. took in all tops 8 to top 8 1/2 flying jib etc. Latter Part light wind and fine weather People variously employed Lat. 30. 29 N. Time 88 in place Long 177. 10

Remarks on Board Saturday Sept 6th 1834

Began with light winds and variable with fine weather ship under single reefed top 10 to the S.S. with a fine smooth sea. 11 1/2 P.M. took in the M. top 8 took in G. and Spunher Middle Port moderate breeze and fine weather. 11 1/2 A.M. made fine Latter Part light winds from the S.S. and fine pleasant weather. Lat by Ob. 29. 56 N. Time 89.

Remarks on Board Sunday Sept 7th 1834

Began with fine pleasant weather wind S.S. 11 1/2 P.M. hoisted the M. top 8 G. and Spunher 11 1/2 P.M. hoisted under the Fore & M. top 8. took in the M. top 8. Middle Port heavy rain from S.S. 11 1/2 A.M. saw Spunher whales toward the Boats and chased them but did not succeed in getting on 11 1/2 Boats returned and the crew got breakfast and went in pursuit of another shoal 11 1/2 the S.S. Boat got fast. Latter Part the S.S. Boat proceeded in getting fast the S.S. Boat line passed and proceeded which compares with our Sunday work in usual up all of our boat work has happened on the S.S. Boat. Latter Part proceeded in killing his whale away from on he would have top in line the M. top 8 and people boats chased the whale that parted the line until 2 o'clock Latter Part light wind and fine clear weather Lat. 30. 39 N. Time 90.

Remarks on Board Monday Sept 8th 1834

Commenced with light winds from the E. and fine pleasant weather 11 1/2 P.M. got the ship to the whale put on the Shark chain to the top 8 G. and Spunher and prepared for taking the whale Middle Port light winds from E. and fine weather 11 1/2 A.M. hoisted on and began to cut at 8 o'clock got in the boat and took in the head People employed in cutting up the joints and other necessary jobs about the deck 11 1/2 began to hoist Latter Part light breeze with squalls. 11 1/2 A.M. some squalls of rain all persons employed in cutting up blubber measuring etc. Lat. 30. 40 N. Time 91.
