

Remarks on Board Tuesday Sept. 9th 1834

Commenced with light winds from the S.W. and fine weather with frequent showers of rain at 2 P.M. quiet boiling on account of the rain at 3 P.M. clear began boiling again at 6 P.M. double reefed the top 8th at 9 finished boiling head at 12 midnight coverd the S.W. Middle Port moderate breeze and fine weather at 8 finished boiling coverd covers People employed in stowing the fore hold of the fresh water pursuing to get down the oil moderate breeze and fine weather from a fine back from the trunks kept off but from them no more Lat. 30° 47' N.

Remarks on Board Wednesday Sept 10th 1834

Commenced with light winds from the S.W. and fine clear weather with employment in various jobs of ship duty at 6 P.M. took in the top 8th and close reefed the fore 8th hauled up the fore sail and hauled by the wind on the fore 8th tack heading N.W. Middle Port steady breeze and fine weather at 6 P.M. put the fore sail top 8th and out reefed out of the fore 8th at 7 kept off. at 8 P.M. top 8th Latter Part fresh breeze and clear ship running off E.N. as the rate of 7 knots Lat. 30° 48' N. at 8 P.M. got on Lumar found the Longd. 176° 56' 00" E. then 85°

Remarks on Board Thursday Sept 11th 1834

Commenced with fresh breeze from the S.W. and fine weather ship under top 8th & fore 8th at 2 P.M. squally with light rain took in the top 8th at 6 P.M. double reefed the top 8th and hauled up the fore sail and hauled by the wind on the fore 8th tack Middle Port moderate winds with fine clear weather at 6 P.M. turned the reef out of the top 8th and put the fore 8th People employed in breaking out to flow down oil at 9 A.M. raised a large whale lowerd the Boats in pursuit of her chased her until 11 A.M. and gave up the chase hauled up the Boats Latter Part light winds and clear from the S.W. fine smooth sea from the whale again thermometer at 84 in the Cabin Lat. 30° 52' N.

Remarks on Board Friday Sept 12th 1834

Commenced with light winds from the S.W. and fine clear weather at 6 P.M. lowered the Boats in pursuit of the whale at 8 P.M. got up it proved to be an immense whale whose head pointed out to the S.W. and a half and then kept their distance from the Boats. morning and founding that the Boats could not come within at 6 P.M. being nearly dark cut the line top 2 whole lines and raised the line to the ship hauled up the fore 8th and lay with the line to the mast through the night at 6 P.M. filled down and began break out for flowing down oil Latter Part moderate winds and fine clear weather all hands busily employed in getting down oil Lat. 30° 54' N. then 86°

Long 177° 20' E.

Remarks on Board Saturday Sept 13th 1834

Commenced with light winds from the S.W. and fine clear weather People employed in flowing down oil at 5 P.M. got all down finished the grain to my great joy put down this fine to 66. at 6 P.M. double reefed the top 8th took in the top 8th and hauled up the fore 8th Middle Port moderate winds and fine weather at 6 P.M. were ship to the S.W. out reefed the top 8th at 7 P.M. top 8th Latter Part steady breeze from S.W. and fine clear weather ship heading S.W. Lat. 30° 52' N. then 85° in the Cabin

Remarks on Board Sunday September 14th 1834

Commenced with light winds from the S.W. and fine weather ship heading S.W. at 6 P.M. took in top 8th Middle Port moderate breeze with fine thundering lightning from the S.W. at 9 A.M. specially took in fore 8th at 11 P.M. again saw a ship on the S.W. quarter to N.W. Latter Part light winds with squalls from the S.W. Lat. 30° 52' N. then 84° in the Cabin employment as usual on the Sabbath in making

Observations on Monday Sept 15th 1834

Commenced with moderate winds from the S.W. ship on the wind to S.W. under top 8th & fore 8th at 6 P.M. quite moderate & pleasant wind S.W. for fine and smooth Middle Port light winds and fine weather at 6 P.M. were ship to the S.W. the strange sail in sight to the North founding 14. at 7 saw sperm whales off the bow bound North towards ship to the North and found them going fast at 8 P.M. saw the strange sail lower her boats and got fast the whales 4 miles to windward of us and ahead Latter Part moderate winds and fine weather Lat. 30° 57' N. Longd. 177° 20' 00" E.
