at 10 o'clock P.M. discharged the  
 Pilot at 4 o'clock landed  
 here & per compass dist 8 miles  
 the Bark Sappho in company

These 24 hours pleasant  
 weather strong breezes  
 saw two sails steering to S.E.

Comes in with strong  
 breezes and clear weather  
 on part light breezes and  
 ends with a strong breeze

All these 24 hours strong  
 breezes and squally clouds  
 relieved the ship

Strong breezes on end of  
 most moderate made S.

Begins with a moderate gale and  
 rain have too much close reefed  
 Main topsail on part wind  
 and weather the same and  
 ends so saw a ship steering  
 to NW

Begins with a strong gale  
 with rain the ship under  
 easy sail on part wind  
 and weather the same and  
 ends so

First part squally with  
 rain saw a bark and a ship  
 on and S.W. wind and  
 weather about the same

Begins with a strong gale and  
 rain ends with moderate  
 breezes and fine weather
