Dec 20	10.57	Strong gales with rain throughout and ends so
Dec 21	11.47	Strong breezes with rain & P. more moderate set double reefed Top sails
Dec 22	13.16	A strong breeze throughout the 24 hours and cloudy saw a Bark and a ship
Dec 23	14.16	First part strong breezes and squally headed to NW by 1 P.M. saw two sails and with more moderate
Dec 24	14.12	Moderate breezes and fair weather exchanged signals with a Dutch Bark on and by light breezes and fine weather employed in painting the Bow Boat
Dec 25	13.41	Light air and fine weather on P. wind and weather the same at 10 o'clock A.M. lowered for 1 P.M. Whales struck two killed one and drew from the other got the Waite Boat capped Hook the Whale alongside and cut him in and made sail in chase of the Whales
