Thursday March 30th 1854
got 110 bbls of Irish Potatoes from
Capt Nye

Friday March 31st

got off 20 bbls more of sweet
Potatoes and 4 barrels Charles
Burgess David C Smith and
Thomas H Rockwell deserted in
company with one of Capt Nye's
men they are the first that
have made the attempt during
the voyage at 10 A.M. got under
way and stood out of the Harbor

Saturday April 1st

At 2 P.M. the Mount Vernon
came out thick and
raining the three ships in
company S.P. sailing

Sunday April 2nd

Laying off and caught Smith
one Boats crew ashore all night
the Mount Vernon and the Bengall
of N.S. laying off and

Monday April 3rd

Laying off and on for the
deserters the Bowditch and Black
Warrior laying off and

Tuesday April 4th

Laying off and on in company
with the Black Warrior and
Bowditch and Mount Vernon

Wednesday April 5th

Caught Charles Burgess
Ship ped a Heanaka for
the cruise the Samuel
Robertson and Meador in
sight steered N.W.

Thursday April 6th
Came in calm at 12 hours and 10
minutes from lowered for
Sperm Whales going quick to S.W.
at 4 P.M. struck a large whale
got two Boats stove lost a line
and some craft and let him
go lay too through the night
at 9 P.M. kept off West lat 27.23 N
Long 145.21 W

Friday April 7th

Came in with strong breezes
from N. lat 27.22 N Long 145.21 W

Saturday April 8th

Strong breezes throughout from
S.W. On P. split the Fore Top sail
and the blowing strong S.P.
more Moderate backed the Black
Warrior Lat 28.36 N Long 140.04 W

Sunday April 9th

Moderate breezes N.W. the Black
Warrior in company Employed
in Repairing the Bow Boat
On and S.P. fine weather steered
N.W. wind E lat 28.33 N Long 139.08 W

Monday April 10th

Light breezes from S.W. steered
N.W. Employed in repairing
the Seaboard Boat

Tuesday April 11th

Light air and fine weather
from N.W. On P. strong breeze
and squally with rain split
a Fore Top sail and threw it
away S.P. fine weather
steered N.W. in sight steered
lat 28.11 N Long 137.41 W

Wednesday April 12th

Strong breezes from S.W. and squally
headed N.W. S.P. wind steady
lat 28.18 N Long 136.55 W
