

At 6 P.M. wore off shore the
Colonel bore N.W. saw two sails
on P. rain S. P. foggy. saw six ships
and two Whales. Saw two ships boiling
and the James Cooper of Nant
cutting No Obs

Saturday June 3rd

Came in foggy several ships
close to at 4 P.M. boarded the
Levi Starbuck. Levegar of N.S.
one whale and a half this season
on P. clear S. P. thick with clear
weather at intervals lowered
several times without success
rugged wind N.E. saw several ships
No Obs

Sunday June 4th

Strong breezes from N.E. and
rugged chasing whales to no
purpose saw the Bark Superior
and several other ships on P.
lay aback at 3 A.M. lowered truck
and killed a whale and sunk him
at 11 struck and killed a whale
saw 20 ships and Barks several
of them boiling nearly all of
them chasing whales lat 55-56

Monday June 5th

At 2 P.M. took the whale along side
and cut in on P. lay aback
S. P. cleared up the decks and started
the dry works saw several whales
going quick lowered without
success saw 43 ships No Obs

Tuesday June 6th

Fresh breezes from S.W. to E.
and fair weather at 1 o'clock
P.M. lowered truck and killed
a whale and took him along
side saw 12 ships trying out and
cutting at 7 P.M. spoke the
Warren Smith of F. S. Bury
3 whales at 8 P.M. exchanged signals
with a clipper ship showing a blue

Flag with a white ball in the center with
the letter G in it supposed her to be
the Rainbow S. P. cutting and boiling
the Alexander Barkley of Bremen
passed us boiling saw several ships boiling
ends with fog No Obs

Wednesday June 7th

Came in with fog at 3 P.M. finished
cutting in cleared up the decks
on and S. P. calm with light air from
the S and E at intervals with fog occasional
only lowered for whales several times
without success saw ice to the S.W.
a great many ships in sight boiling
and chasing whales saw one taken
a whale employed in boiling and
various other boats of ships with
Lat By Obs 55-28 N Long 141-47 East

Thursday June 8th

Came in calm and thick with
intervals of clear weather chased
whales to no purpose saw several
ships employed in boiling saw
several ships boiling on P. at 12 mid
night found the ship in the ice
wore ship and got out of it as
soon as possible thick fog S. P.
employed in stowing down and
boiling thick fog No Obs

Friday June 9th

Came in thick fog employed
in boiling and stowing down
on P. at 9 P.M. lighted up a little
saw two ships saw a piece of ice
to the West on P. cleared up S. P. the
ice still in sight saw about 40 sails
in all several of them in the
ice saw three or four whales
during the day lowered once without
success employed in boiling and
stowing down Lat 55-48 N Long 141-25 E

Saturday June 10th

Came in fine wind S.W. employed
in boiling and stowing down the ice
close to a great number of ships in sight
