Monday June 12th

Came in with a fresh breeze from S.W. the ship in the ice passed the ship Alexander Barclay saw the Mary and Martha and the citizen the Mercury George Washington and the Caroline chased Whales without success saw the Mary of Kent 2 Whales on P calm L.P. saw Whales lowered and chased without success employed in scraping ice and making room saw several sails saw one ship strike and lost a line Lat 55.43 N Long 141.34

Tuesday June 13th

Fresh breeze from S.E. and ruggel lowered for Whales struck ship lost a line saw an other ship do Ditto on P fresh breeze L.P. lowered for Whales struck and killed one saw several other ships whaling and boiling Lat 55.34 Long 141.00

Wednesday June 14th

Calm at 2 P.M. took the whale alongside and cut him in at 9 P.M. the Bark Hanna left Nye came down and spoke us on whale this season on P fine weather L.P. cleaning up

ships chasing Whales saw the Good Return cutting No Obs Long 141.40

Thursday June 15th

Light breeze saw a Bowhead and chased him without success saw the ships Tamarack Neil 2 Whales and Goleonda Dougherty 3 Whales on P lay aback L.P. at 4 P.M. lowered for Bowheads but without success employed in boiling saw the ship Mechanic of Newport strike and lose a whale the Hannys Boats chasing No Obs Lat 55.40 Long 141.55

Friday June 16th

Came in with a strong breeze from S.E. and cloudy the land in sight the wind veered whaling she struck and lost one that No in company boiling on and L.P. boiling lowered for a whale but without success saw several ships No Obs

Saturday June 17th

Came in cloudy and a light breeze from N. saw 43 ships boarded the Alice Frasier 6 Whales on P lay aback L.P. employed in stowing down foggy No Obs

Sunday June 18th

Came in thick fog employed in stowing down spoke the Bark Baltic Books 2 Whales employed in stowing down stored West several sails in sight Lat 55.56 N

Monday June 19th

Came in with light breeze and fine weather the coast of ice in sight stored in forenoon saw several ships in shore L.P. tasked to the call the other ships standing off shore saw no Bowheads spoke the ship Splinter Smith of Cold Springs 4 Whales Lat 55.16 N
