

Monday July 17th

The Boats off after whales but saw none many of the ships leaving the Bay trailed out the blubber & P got under way and beat out towards the mouth of the Bay at 5 P.M. came to on account of thick the Ocean of Warren and Caroline came to at the same time

Tuesday July 18th

Comes in foggy the Boats looking for Bowheads I went ashore and got a Boat load of Wood

Wednesday July 19th

Left anchor several ships passed out of the Bay the Boats looking for Whales

Thursday July 20th

Calm several ships under way with a fair tide the Boats off after Bowheads

Friday July 21st

Lying at Anchor at the mouth of the Bay several ships in sight at Anchor

Saturday July 22^d

Got under way and steered N.E. the Ocean in company

Sunday July 23^d

Steering to the N.E. heard a ship firing guns through the night on and S.P. thick fog passed a Boat haying by a Whale came to Anchor close to the Samuel Robertson. Washed of Fair Haven 15 Whales

Monday July 24

Got under weigh the Boats chasing Whales struck and lost a line the Copia struck and lost a line also the Natches and Horatio in sight the Caravan about

Tuesday July 25th

The Boats off saw two whales

Wednesday July 26th

Two Boats off after Whales got under way thick at 5 P.M. cleared up the Boats came on board

Thursday July 27th

Thick Fog with a gale

Friday July 28th

Cleared up lowered for Whales without success at 5 hours and 30 minutes P.M. let go the Anchor 7 ships in sight at Anchor on and S.P. thick fog wind S.W.

Saturday July 29th

Thick S.W. and thick Fog throughout the 24 hours

Sunday July 30th

Comes in with a fresh breeze from S.E. with thick fog on P. thick and rainy S.P. thick up a short time lowered struck and killed a Whale the ship under way anchored close to the whale but the tide being very strong it took the Whales off about 3 miles anchored him and got the ship under way again but to no purpose the diving men saw the
