

Sunday Sept 10th 1854

Light breezes from NW at sunset all the boats on board 4 P thick fog took the Anchor and stood down the Bay at 10 o'clock let go again at 11 lighted up again took the Anchor again and stood in towards the watering place at 12 noon came to anchor in 7 fathoms in company with the Bark Harmony Black Warrior and Bengal the Rambler and India went out

Monday Sept 11

Employed in wooding and watering the other ships also wooding and watering at 9 AM came on the blow from NW got under and left three o'clock on the beach

Tuesday Sept 12th

Strong gales from NW and thick and rain bore away for Diamond Bay in company with the Harmony bark and Black Warrior at 6 PM came to anchor in side of the Saug Spit in 7 fathoms of water Blue midget found seven ships at anchor

Wednesday Sept 13th

Employed in getting ready to water

Thursday Sept 14

Employed in watering 4 P following strong from NW out side it is very rough this I consider a safe place to lay took the anchor and floated in shore

Friday Sept 15

Strong breezes from NE the Harmony and bark and Ellen came in to anchor the two former left here bound to the Sandwich Islands but were obliged to return again the weather not being so favourable outside as it is in here

Saturday Sept 16th

Came in with moderate breeze from NE and clear weather sent two boats up to the heads of the Bay the Barks Ellen Harmony and bark hauled in shore at 5 P wind NW blowing fresh

Sunday Sept 17th

Strong breezes from NW to N all the day 24 hours

Monday Sept 18th

Fresh breezes from N and all these 24 hours and thick all the first part birds clear employed drying bone

Tuesday Sept 19th

Came in with light breezes from NW to SE and fine weather employed in drying bone and cloudy and strong breezes

Wednesday Sept 20th

Came in with strong breeze from N and rain let the other Anchor up to fine

Thursday Sept 21st

Light breezes from NW and thick weather the Montpelier Gray Weather and to anchor
