

at 9 O'clock P.M. left H
and the next morning
saw 50 whales in company with
the Bark Atlantic still being
in the midst of the whales
she set her colored to mate
we got 6 whales & she got 2
we had several sick at
the time they are about all
well now since the 3 we
have been drifted about
in calm experienced a
very strong current setting
to the South by night
to the South by night

Since 10th Since writing the last
report we have been to the
Foulweather and Sanguin Hummock
Islands off the last named
Isle we spoke the Bark Newark
Smith Master of N.B. 30 months
out 1000 bbls. also spoke the
Bark Rodman and kept
company with her through the
Straits of Basselard and up
the Coast of Mindanao to the
Suriago Passage on the 10th
of May saw a school of 40
Whales of Point Gordon took six
of them the whales took six
passed a shoal with less than
20 fathoms of water on
some parts of it not laid
down on my chart in my
possession On the 6th of the
month in going through the
Straits of Balabac saw a
Bark ashore on the Reef about
3 miles S.W. of the Manguee Is.
Supposed to be the City
of Palaces of Liverpool we
took from her sails and Rigging
ally anchor and chain and various
other articles Lat 6° 32' North
Long 114° 13'

Wednesday June 11th
Light air and calm we
are now in the China sea
about 42 miles to the Eastward
of Louisa Shoal at 4 hours &
30 minutes P.M. saw a school of
Sperm Whales going quick to NE
lowered but without success
bowed with fresh breezes from
East to N Lat 6° 40' N
Long 113° 50' East

Thursday June 12th
Light breezes from NE
and fine weather steered N.E.
to sight Louisa Shoal we
are about 30 miles to the
East of it. P.M. at 4 O'clock saw
a large Sperm Whale going to Windward
lowered the Boat and chased but
without success as he stayed down
an hour so that he had but one
rising after the Boat lowered
Lat 6° 30' N Long 112° 25' East

Friday June 13th
Light variable winds and
squally with rain steered
off to the West. P.M. fine
headed by winds to N.W.
Lat 6° 30' N Long 112° 33' E

Saturday June 14th
A.M. a fine breeze from
N.N.E. and clouds with thunder
and lightning steered N and S
Lat 6° 40' N Long 112° 26' E
P.M. steered to S.W. by wind
squally and a strong breeze
on P.M. more moderate at day
made sail

Sunday June 15th
A.M. calm P.M. fine weather
Lat 6° 50' N Long 112° 50' N P.M. Cal
at sunset took in sail in P.M. Cal
