Calm with light airs
at intervals the last week
we have had strong S.W.
winds and have been trying
to hold on betwixt the
Royal Charlotte and Louisian
Shoals the Old Ship did
first rate gainst to windward
daily against wind and swell
Lat 6²⁷ North Long 112⁵⁸ E

Monday Oct 6th Calm On the 3rd
of Sept saw sperm whales
to windward going quick
lowered but without success
had hard squalls and very rough
Oct 3rd saw sperm (Whaled again
to windward 4 1/2 miles off at
20 minutes to 5 o'clock P.M. lowered
but did not get to the whale
till after sunset Oct 4th
saw sperm whales again got
one the Barks Rodman and
Atlantic in sight last eve
sold the Rodman a Hedge anchor
one we got from the Kitt of
Palaces Oct 2 sold the Barks
Atlantic 1 topsail 1 spanker 1 old
Main sail 1 fore topmast stay sail
1 Old stay sail 1 Gaff topsail
1 awning on from the Barks City of
P.

Friday Oct 10th

The last few days have had
calm and a strong current with
S.W. have been to 111.37 East
yesterday saw three sails today
a fresh breeze the Rodman
in sight bound off
Lat 6.50 N. Long 112.40 E

Thursday Oct 16th

Strong breezes from S.W. to S.W. by
and squally weather headed
by wind to West at 11 o'clock
Wore to S.W. Lat 6.37 N Long 112.25 E
last Saturday spoke the Barks Atlantic
and put G. H. Miller on board to
be discharged in Singapore
before the Consul and to be
placed in the Hospital he
being sick I placed 45 dollars
in Capt. Shermans hands to
pay his expenses to the Consul
on Sunday the 12th the ship being
12 miles off she made the signal
for Whales we lowered and
got two she got three on
Tuesday saw her with her ensign
half mast it appears she
had a man fall from the
Main yard and was instantly
killed she lat on Sunday was
6.30 N Long 112.25 East

Thursday Nov 13th

On the 18th of Oct put
away for Sambougon to
get men on the 21st passed
through the Balabock Straits
22nd passed Cagayan Sulu
in company with the Dutch
Ship Orinda of Rotterdam
126th from Cardiff bound to Bossu
with coal 24 anchored in
Sambougon and lay there
till the 3rd of Nov shipped 6
men out the 4th boarded
the ship John Linney of
Richmond Maine 148 days
from Cardiff bound to
Bossellen with coal 500
saw Hummock Island 9th
got sweet potatoes and
stool to the Eastward
