A strong breeze and cloudy started W.N.W. and N.W. by wind the Atlantic in sight nothing of the sporting kind seen Lat Obs 6.27 N Long 112.40 P.M. squally with rain

Wind S.W. to N.W.

A.M. Fresh breezes and clear weather started W.N.W. by wind the Atlantic in sight Lat Obs 6.48 N Long 112.20 E P.M. strong breezes and squally started S.W. by S.W. though reefed the topsails

Since last date have been into Sabuan have wooded and water remained there 12 days left the 12th left the Atlantic there lost one man by desertion. Jim Crow have had all sorts of weather since we left to day the weather is fine very little wind Lat Obs 6.02 N Long 113.48 E

Strong gales and heavy rain squalls nothing seen on the ground Lat Obs 6.11 N Long 110.55 E P.M. weather same

June 25th

A.M. strong breezes and clear weather saw Blackbird Lat Obs 6.10 N Long 110.50 E P.M. fine weather made a new davit for Mast Boat

June 26th

Strong breezes and cloudy wind S.W. saw nothing Lat Obs 7.26 N Long 109.20 E

Saturday

June 27th

Strong breezes and cloudy wind S.W. nothing seen Lat Obs 7.46 N Long 109.11 E
