Remarks on board Cape Horn Pigeon

Sunday Jan 16th

First part commenced with fresh breeze and pleasant weather from S.E. cruising, at sundown took in sail. Middle part light breeze, latter part light breeze and clear at daylight made sail saw nothing.

Monday Jan 17th

First part commenced with light breeze and pleasant weather from S.E. at sundown took in sail. Middle part light breeze, latter part calm employed in coal taring the chains and painting the bands

Tuesday Jan 18th

First part commenced with a calm. Middle part the same. Latter part calm, employed in middle stitching the Main topsail.

Wednesday Jan 19th

First part commenced with light airs from S.E. employed in various jobs. Middle part light breeze, latter part fresh breeze, at daylight made sail.

Thursday Jan 20th

First part commenced with fresh breeze from S.E. heading E.N.E. took in sail. Middle part fresh breeze, latter part strong breeze and cloudy. Capt. Hellyer went on board of the Sappho a little while.

Cruising off Masafuera

Sunday Jan 21st

First part commenced with strong breeze and cloudy weather from S.E. Tappie in sight. Middle part strong breeze, latter part strong breeze from S.E. made some sail, saw a large break on the weather quarter, wore ship and started for it but did not see it again.

Saturday Jan 22nd

First part commenced with fresh breeze and clear weather from S.E. at 4 P.M. raised Spinnaker going quick to the windward, lowered the Boats but did not get a chance to strike. Middle part fresh breeze, latter part strong breeze from S.E.

First part commenced with light breeze and clear weather from W.N.W. heading S.W. saw nothing, at sundown took in sail. Middle part light breeze, latter part fresh breeze from different directions.
