Remarks on board Cape Han Pipon
Wednesday June 1st

First part commences with moderate breeze and cloudy weather from S.W. heading E. Middle part moderate breeze. Latter part fresh breeze and cloudy.

Thursday June 2nd

First part commences with fresh breeze from S steering E by N. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part strong breeze and clear.

Friday June 3rd

First part commences with strong breeze and clear weather from S steering E by S. Double reefed the topsails. Middle part fresh breeze made more sail. Latter part fresh breeze and clear.

Saturday June 4th

First part commences with fresh breeze and cloudy weather from S steering E by S. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part fresh breeze and clear.

Sunday June 5th

First part commences with fresh breeze and cloudy weather steering E by N. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part fresh breeze and cloudy at 10 A.M. raised the land.

Monday June 6th

First part commences with fresh breeze and cloudy weather. got up the chains and bent on the anchors. at 5 P.M. anchored at Atacamas. Middle part calm. Latter part light breeze sent a raft of casks ashore.

Tuesday June 7th

First part commences with fresh breeze and clear weather went ashore and filled the raft but could not get it off on account of the tide. Middle part calm. Latter part moderate breeze towed the raft on board.

Wednesday June 8th

First part commences with moderate breeze toward the water below. Middle part light breeze. Latter part moderate breeze sent the raft ashore and got some fruit.

Thursday June 9th

(Clear. De Barro) (deserted) First part commences with light breeze and clear weather went ashore and filled the raft. traded some for recruits. Middle part light breeze. Latter part moderate breeze.

Friday June 10th

First part commences with fresh breeze and clear weather towed off the raft of water. the Matilda bears. Anchored close to us. Middle part light breeze. Latter part light breeze and cloudy.
