Remarks on board Cape Horn Pigeon

Saturday June 11th

First part commences with fresh breeze and cloudy weather at 2 P.M. took our anchor and went to sea. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part fresh breeze and clear steering & repaired the fore sail

Sunday June 12th

First part commences with fresh breeze and clear weather from S.W. steering N. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part fresh breeze and clear.

Monday June 13th

First part commences with fresh breeze from W steering N by W. Middle part moderate breeze. Latter part squally.

Tuesday June 14th

First part commences with moderate breeze from S.W. steering N by W. Middle part rainy. Latter part moderate breeze from S. saw the Pearl Islands.

Wednesday June 15th

First part commences with moderate breeze and clear weather from S at 7 P.M. Anchored under the lee of Rejo's Island. Middle part calm. Latter part calm and rainy at 11 1/2 A.M. hove up anchor and started for Panama

Thursday June 16th

First part commences with fresh breeze and cloudy weather from S steering N.W. at 7 P.M. Anchored at Panama. Middle part light breeze. Latter part fresh breeze employed in breaking out oil

Friday June 17th

First part commences with fresh breeze and clear weather at sundown a lighter came along side. Middle part light breeze one of the boatmen and 3 men swam to the lighter and took her boat and went ashore. Latter part strong breeze and rain squalls put some oil on board of the lighter and got the rest on deck.

Saturday June 18th

First part commences with strong breeze and quite rugged could not take the lighter along side it was so rough. Middle part light breeze. Latter part light breeze and heavy rain put the rest of the oil into the lighter and sent the Starboard Watch ashore on liberty

Sunday June 19th

First part commences with a calm. Middle part light breeze. Latter part calm. Starboard Watch ashore on liberty

Monday June 20th

First part commences with a calm. Middle part calm. Latter part calm employed in stowing the ground tier and breaking out shocks &c.
