Remarks on board Cape Horn Region

Sunday Aug 21st

First part light breeze. at night the boats came aboard, saw no Whales. Middle part light breeze Latter part light breeze lowered 3 boats

Monday Aug 22nd

First part light breeze the Mast Boat struck a Whale but after being fast while the horn came out. Middle part calm Latter part light breeze lowered 3 boats stowed down oil

Tuesday Aug 23rd

First part commences with light breeze at night the boats came on board. Middle part light breeze. Latter part calm lowered 3 boats

Wednesday Aug 24th

First part light breeze Whales very scarce Middle part light breeze. Latter part light breeze hove up anchor and lowered 3 boats

Thursday Aug 25th

First part commences with light breeze and pleasant weather the Bow Boat struck a Whale. Killed him at dark to the windward of the Ship at 9th P.M. anchored the Ship 2 boats layed by the Whale all night. Middle part light breeze Latter part light breeze towed the Whale to the Ship and cut him in

In Panama Bay

Friday Aug 26th

First part calm employed in cutting up blubber started the hooks. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part light breeze hove up the anchor and lowered 2 boats

Saturday Aug 27th

First part commences with light breeze. the Starboard Boat struck a Whale. killed him and he sunk. hauled him up with one boat, fluked him and put the finchpin on for the night. Middle part rainy. Latter part moderate breeze cut in the Whale and cut the blubber up

Sunday Aug 28th

First part commences with light breeze started the work and stowed down oil. Middle part light breeze. Latter part light breeze lowered 2 boats finished haling

Monday Aug 29th

First part commences with light breeze hove up the anchor. at night the boats came aboard. anchored again. Middle part light breeze. Latter part light breeze and calm lowered 3 boats

Tuesday Aug 30th

First part commences with moderate breeze. Middle part light breeze. Latter part calm lowered 3 boats
